Requires the Attorney General to adopt and maintain a list of foreign adversaries who are ineligible to receive conveyances of certain land, mineral or water interests. Makes unauthorized conveyances void.

Requires the Employment Department to study unemployment insurance in Oregon. Directs the department to submit a report of the study to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to employment no later than September 15, 2026. Sunsets January 2, 2027.

<b>Digest:</b> The Act tells OED to study issues related to paid family and medical leave. A report will be submitted by September 15 of next year. (Flesch Readability Score: 62.1). Requires the Employment Department to study issues related to the family and medical leave insurance program. Directs the department to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to business and labor not later than September 15, 2026. Sunsets on January 2, 2027.

Digest: The Act makes a task force about health care on-the-job training and career pathways. (Flesch Readability Score: 71.7).  
 [Digest: The Act makes BOLI study and report on matters relating to on-the-job training programs in this state. Tells BOLI to submit a report by September 15 of next year. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.0).]  
 [Requires the Bureau of Labor and Industries to conduct a study of matters relating to apprenticeship programs in this state. Directs the bureau to submit findings to interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to business and labor not later than September 15, 2026.]  
 Establishes the Task Force on Health Care Apprenticeships and Career Pathways. Requires the task force to identify challenges in navigating the requirements for licensure, accreditation and apprenticeships for health care providers. Requires the task force to submit a report to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to health care no later than September 15, 2026.  
 Sunsets December 31, 2026.

 Makes an owner and a direct contractor jointly and severally liable in a civil action for any unpaid wages owed to the unrepresented employees of the direct contractor and subcontractors at any tier. Provides the statute of limitations for actions regarding recovery for unpaid and overtime wages.  
 Requires subcontractors to provide certain payroll records and other information to the owner or the direct contractor, upon request. Permits the owner and the direct contractor to withhold payment to a subcontractor in certain circumstances.

 Appropriates moneys to the Oregon Business Development Department to provide grants to specified cities to build infrastructure that will contribute to the development of housing under the program established by a 2024 Act. Extends sunsets for the program and for cities' reports on the program.  
 Declares an emergency, effective July 1, 2025.

 Adjusts certain economic development program statutes related to the administration of the programs.

Digest: The Act tells agencies to look at their rules and simplify them. (Flesch Readability Score: 81.8).  
 Directs every agency to review the agency's administrative rules and amend the rules to simplify the rules and eliminate redundancy.

Digest: The Act would let Business Oregon set the dollar cap on grants to ports from the Port Planning and Marketing Fund by rule. (Flesch Readability Score: 69.4).  
 [Digest: The Act tells DAS to do a study on ports. (Flesch Readability Score: 100.0).]  
 [Requires the Oregon Department of Administrative Services to study ports. Directs the department to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to ports not later than September 15, 2026.]  
 [Sunsets on January 2, 2027.]  
 Replaces the dollar cap on grants awarded to ports from the Port Planning and Marketing Fund with a maximum amount adopted by the Oregon Business Development Department by rule.

 Directs the Water Resources Department to study innovative water technologies. Directs the department to submit a report to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to natural resources not later than September 15, 2026.  
 Appropriates moneys out of the General Fund to the department for the purpose of undertaking the study.  
 Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

 Requires employers who provide sick leave, vacation leave or personal business leave benefits to employees to compensate employees for all earned but unused accrued leave when employment terminates.

 Requires employers to compensate employees for time spent on call or on standby. Requires employers to post work schedules at least 14 days in advance, including all scheduled on-call and standby shifts.

**Status:** Referred to Labor and Workplace Standards with subsequent referral to Ways and Means.

**Digest:** The Act clarifies that employees can take sick leave for a mental health condition. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.7).  
 Clarifies the meaning of "mental health condition" for purposes of sick leave provisions to include leave taken to restore the employee or the employee's family member to a state of mental well-being.  
 Requires the Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries to develop informational materials and training opportunities on the relationship between mental and physical health and the benefits of mental health leave.  
 Permits the Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries to enter into contracts with mental health professionals to investigate retaliation complaints involving absences relating to a mental health condition. Requires the commissioner to adopt rules concerning retaliation for absences related to a mental health condition.

**Digest:** Tells a public agency not to take an offer for a public contract from a not-for-profit company if the person who earns the most money at the company earns more than 50 times as much as the person who earns the least money. Takes effect on the 91st day after the session ends. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.2).  
 Provides that a contracting agency may not accept a bid or proposal for a public contract from a covered entity for which the ratio between highest amount of total compensation and lowest amount of total compensation that the covered entity pays employees of the covered entity exceeds 50 to 1.  
 Requires a contracting agency to disclose the prohibition in an advertisement or solicitation for the public contract and provide in the public contract that a failure to comply subjects the covered entity to a termination of the public contract and debarment or disqualification, as appropriate.  
 Becomes operative on January 1, 2026.  
 Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Digest:** This Act updates the laws about how public employers should give priority to veterans when hiring for jobs. If they choose not to hire a veteran, they have to write down their reasons in certain situations. If a veteran or disabled veteran thinks they were treated unfairly, they must first try to solve the problem with BOLI before they can take action. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.3).

Modifies law regarding the requirement that a public employer grant preference to a veteran or disabled veteran in the selection process for a civil service position. Requires evidence of eligibility and disability to be provided at the time of application. Sets forth processes for granting one or more preferences.

Allows a public employer to exercise discretion not to appoint a qualified veteran or disabled veteran to a civil service position based solely on the veteran's or disabled veteran's merits or qualification in the final stage of the selection process. Requires a public employer to provide written reasons for not appointing a veteran or disabled veteran to a position under certain circumstances.

Requires an aggrieved veteran or disabled veteran to exhaust nonjudicial remedies with the Bureau of Labor and Industries before filing a civil action for an unlawful employment practice.

**Digest:** The Act tells state agencies to try to contract with bidders who agree to help with emergency readiness. The Act tells ODEM to start a program to certify such bidders. (Flesch Readability Score: 64.7).

Directs contracting agencies to give preference to a bidder or proposer who is certified by the Oregon Department of Emergency Management as an emergency preparedness partner.

Directs the department to establish a program for certification of business organizations as emergency preparedness partners. Provides that organizations shall be certified if a minimum number of individuals in the organization complete the required training and meet other requirements.

Permits a collective bargaining agreement to prescribe due dates for the payment of wages upon termination that do not require interpretation. Provides that penalty wages may be imposed against employers who fail to pay such wages by the prescribed due date.

Requires the Land Conservation and Development Commission to update the statewide land use planning goal relating to "citizen involvement" by rule by [June 30, 2027] June 30, 2029. Requires the advisory committee appointed by the Department of Land Conservation and Development to provide the commission with draft recommendations by June 30, 2027.

Requires the Department of Land Conservation and Development to make recommendations by December 31, 2026, relating to the goal amendment process to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly [relating] related to land use.

Establishes the Public Involvement Goal Update Fund. Appropriates moneys to the department for deposit into the fund.

Sunsets January 2, 2030.

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

Status: Third reading. Carried by Helm. Passed.

Digest: The Act increases a tax on short-term lodging. The Act changes the name of a subaccount related to wildlife. The Act lists how moneys from the increase must be distributed. (Flesch Readability Score: 69.7).  
[Digest: The Act increases a tax on short-term lodging. The Act changes the name of a subaccount related to wildlife. The Act says that moneys from the increase in the tax must be put in a subaccount. (Flesch Readability Score: 77.1).]  
Increases the state transient lodging tax. Changes the name of the Oregon Conservation Strategy Subaccount to the Recovering Oregon's Wildlife Fund Subaccount. [Transfers moneys attributable to the increase of the state transient lodging tax to the Recovering Oregon's Wildlife Fund Subaccount.] Specifies how moneys attributable to the increase are to be distributed.  
Applies the transient lodging tax increase to transient lodging charges occurring on or after January 1, 2026.  
Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Digest: The Act gives money to HECC to give out for water-related research and grants. (Flesch Readability Score: 71.7).  
Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for distribution to the University of Oregon and Portland State University for water-related research and grants.  
Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Status: Public Hearing held.

Digest: The Act limits the number of measure requests that may be made of LC during long regular sessions to stated numbers. The Act sets forth exceptions to those limits. (Flesch Readability Score: 69.5).  
Limits to 25 the number of legislative measures that a member of the Legislative Assembly may ask the Legislative Counsel to prepare for a regular session of the Legislative Assembly that begins in an odd-numbered year. Limits to 15 the number of legislative measures that a committee of the Legislative Assembly may ask the Legislative Counsel to prepare for a regular session of the Legislative Assembly that begins in an odd-numbered year. Provides exceptions.  
Limits to 400 the number of legislative measures that the Governor and state agencies under the authority of the Governor may ask the Legislative Counsel to prepare for a regular session of the Legislative Assembly that begins in an odd-numbered year. Provides exceptions. Limits to 25 the number of legislative measures that other statewide elected officials may ask the Legislative Counsel to prepare for a regular session of the Legislative Assembly that begins in an odd-numbered year. Limits to 100 the number of legislative measures that the Judicial Department may ask the Legislative Counsel to prepare for a regular session of the Legislative Assembly that begins in an odd-numbered year.

**Bill #: HB 2020** Title: QRF

Subject: Public Contracting  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Ways and Means by order of Speaker.

Digest: Says that a company that gives work to people with disabilities must use people with disabilities for at least 50 percent of the work hours that go into making goods or doing services. Says what must happen if a public agency ends a contract for goods or services and a new company takes over. Says that the new contract must have a health plan as good as or better than the health plan in the old contract. (Flesch Readability Score: 64.3).  
[Digest: Says that a company that gives work to people with disabilities must use people with disabilities for at least 50 percent of the work hours that go into making goods or doing services. Says what must happen if a public agency ends a contract for goods or services and a new company takes over. Says that the new contract must have a health plan as good as or better than the health plan in the old contract. Says the new contract can do this by joining a labor union's health plan or giving benefits as good as those in the Oregon Health Plan. (Flesch Readability Score: 64.0).]  
Requires that qualified nonprofit agencies for individuals with disabilities employ individuals with disabilities for not less than 50 percent of the work hours of direct labor required for manufacturing or providing products or services.  
Requires that a service provider that enters into a contract with a public agency to provide goods or services after the public agency terminated or declined to renew a previous contract with a different service provider must reimburse individuals with disabilities who were employed under the previous contract for amounts the individuals with disabilities paid for continuation coverage and must in the new contract provide health benefits that are as favorable as, or more favorable than, the health benefits available under the previous contract. [Permits the successor service provider to provide health benefits through enrollment in a health plan that a labor organization maintains or to provide health benefits that are as favorable as, or more favorable than, the benefits available under the Oregon Health Plan.] Requires the new contract to provide the health benefits at the first opportunity in which employee enrollment in the new employer's benefit plan becomes available, but not later than one year after the effective date of the new contract.  
Requires the Oregon Department of Administrative Services to confirm that a public agency or qualified nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities has included the provisions required in the Act in any new contract with a successor service provider. Permits the department to require amendment of the new contract to incorporate the required provisions and to impose a civil penalty of not more than \$500 for each day in which the parties to the new contract fail to incorporate the required provisions.

Digest: The Act gives money to DAS to grant to Oasis of Praise for real property. (Flesch Readability Score: 84.4).  
Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services for distribution to Oasis of Praise International Ministries to acquire, renovate and rehabilitate real property.  
Declares an emergency, effective July 1, 2025.

**Bill #: HB 2054**      Title: Farmland to wetlands      Subject: Environment

Status: Referred to Agriculture, Land Use, Natural Resources, and Water.

Digest: This Act says that projects that convert farmland to wetlands must be approved by a local government. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.1).  
Requires local government approval of a project to create, enhance or restore wetlands if the project would convert lands used for agricultural purposes to wetlands.

Digest: The Act gives certain rights about certain acts related to blockchains. (Flesch Readability Score: 64.9).  
Prohibits state and local governments from restricting certain activities related to blockchain protocols and digital assets.  
Prohibits state and local governments from imposing charges on digital assets used as a method of payment.  
Exempts certain activities related to blockchain protocols and digital assets from the Oregon Money Transmitters Act.

Status: Chapter 191, (2025 Laws): effective on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Digest: The Act would extend the partial tax break for vertical housing projects. (Flesch Readability Score: 67.7).  
Extends the sunset date for the partial property tax exemption for the property of vertical housing development projects.  
Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Bill #: HB 2075**      Title: Brownfield Property Tax Sunset      Subject: Finance & Tax  
Position:      Staff: ML

Status: Informational Meeting held.

Digest: The Act would extend the sunset of certain property tax breaks for brownfields. (Flesch Readability Score: 69.9).  
Extends the sunset for the property tax incentive benefit programs for brownfields and property on brownfields.  
Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Bill #: HB 2079**      Title: Property Tax Study      Subject: Finance & Tax

Status: Public Hearing held.

Digest: The Act would require a study of the property tax system in this state. A report will be submitted by September 15 of next year. (Flesch Readability Score: 72.3).  
Requires the Legislative Revenue Officer to study the property tax system in this state. Directs the officer to submit a report to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to revenue no later than September 15, 2026.  
Sunsets on January 2, 2027.

Status: Referred to Revenue with subsequent referral to Ways and Means.

Requires an aggrieved veteran or disabled veteran to exhaust nonjudicial remedies with the Bureau of Labor and Industries before filing a civil action for an unlawful employment practice.

Requires an insurer each year to remit to Director of the Department of Consumer and Business Services a surcharge for each policy of insurance that is property insurance. Permits an insurer each year to recoup from insureds the amount the insurer remitted to the director. Requires the director to deposit the proceeds of the surcharge into the Oregon Wildfire Preparedness and Community Protection Fund. Imposes a filing fee for property taxes and requires remission of the proceeds of the fee, less a specified percentage for administrative costs, to the Oregon Wildfire Preparedness and Community Protection Fund. Sunsets July 1, 2033.

Subject: Public Safety

Status: Referred to Veterans, Emergency Management, Federal and World Affairs.

Digest: The Act tells ODEM to do a study on emergency management. The Act tells ODEM to report on its study. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.5).

Requires the Oregon Department of Emergency Management to study emergency management. Directs the department to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to emergency management not later than September 15, 2026.

Sunsets on January 2, 2027.

**Bill #: SB 165** Title: Historically Filled Lands

Subject: Environment  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Effective date, May 28, 2025.

Digest: This Act amends and repeals laws about the State Land Board's power to claim title to historically filled lands. (Flesch Readability Score: 62.8).

Amends the requirements for the State Land Board to assert title to historically filled lands or assert a right to minerals or geothermal resources in historically filled lands. Repeals, on January 2, 2029, the provisions related to assertion of title to historically filled lands by the State Land Board that are required to be completed before December 31, 2025.

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

**Bill #: SB 179** Title: Recreational Immunity

Subject: General Gov  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Effective date, January 1, 2026.

Digest: This Act makes permanent changes to the laws that shield landowners from lawsuits from visitors. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.8).

Makes permanent the temporary changes made to the landowner immunity laws by chapter 64, Oregon Laws 2024. Extends local government immunity to explicitly include claims arising via the use of nonhorse equines.

**Bill #: SB 212** Title: Library Materials

Subject: General Gov  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Education.

Digest: The Act would set up a ratings system for library materials based on the age of young library patrons and restrict access as guided by the ratings. The Act would require the State Librarian to keep a public list of the ratings. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.6).  
Establishes a ratings system for library materials available to young individuals based on appropriateness for different age groups. Requires public and school libraries to make library materials available only in accordance with the ratings. Directs the State Librarian to develop and maintain a public central list of the ratings.

**Bill #: SB 224** Title: Candidate Addresses

Subject: Elections  
Position: Staff: HW

Status: Speaker signed.

Digest: The Act keeps the SOS from posting the address of those persons who are linked to a political committee on the SOS website. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.7).  
[Digest: The Act keeps the SOS from posting the address of those persons who are linked to a campaign committee on the secretary's website. (Flesch Readability Score: 62.1).]  
Prohibits the Secretary of State from publishing the residence address of certain individuals who are affiliated with a [candidate's principal campaign] political committee on the electronic filing system maintained by the secretary.

**Bill #: SB 227** Title: Wage Theft

Subject: Labor  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Labor and Business.

Digest: The Act directs BOLI to conduct a wage theft study. (Flesch Readability Score: 78.2).  
Requires the Bureau of Labor and Industries to study issues related to wage theft. Directs the bureau to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to labor and business not later than September 15, 2026.

**Bill #: SB 233** Title: Health Care Lawsuits

Subject: Health Care  
Position: Staff: HW

Status: Third reading. Carried by Chaichi. Failed.

Digest: The Act says a person can file a suit to get damages for removal of a hernia mesh that occurred at a certain time in the past. (Flesch Readability Score: 66.6).  
[Digest: The Act gives people more time to file claims for injuries from health care. (Flesch Readability Score: 89.8).]  
[Extends the statute of ultimate repose for claims for certain injuries from health care to 10 years from the date of the treatment, omission or operation upon which the action is based.]  
[Applies retroactively to claims for which an action has not been commenced.]  
Allows a person to file an action to recover damages for injuries arising from or in connection with removal of a hernia mesh that occurred on or after January 1, 2018, and before January 1, 2019.  
Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

**Bill #: SB 234** Title: Emergency Mgmt Study

Subject: Public Safety  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Speaker signed.

Digest: Delays the date that ODEM starts to manage the emergency system known as OERS. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.7).  
[Digest: The Act tells ODEM to do a study on emergency management. The Act tells ODEM to report on its study. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.5).]  
[Requires the Oregon Department of Emergency Management to study emergency management. Directs the department to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to emergency management not later than September 15, 2026.]  
[Sunsets on January 2, 2027.]  
Delays the date on which responsibility for management of the state multijurisdictional emergency notification system is transferred from the Department of State Police to the Oregon Department of Emergency Management.  
Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

**Bill #: SB 269** Title: Traffic Offenses RC

Subject: DUII  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Public Hearing and Possible Work Session scheduled.

Digest: The Act tells ODOT to do a study about traffic offenses and report back. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.7).  
Directs the Department of Transportation to study issues related to traffic offenses and to report to an appropriate committee or interim committee of the Legislative Assembly on or before September 15, 2026.  
Sunsets January 2, 2027.



**Bill #: SB 271** Title: Public Safety Standards RC

Subject: Public Safety  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Judiciary.

Digest: The Act tells DPSST to study public safety standards and make a report. (Flesch Readability Score: 63.4). Requires the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to study public safety standards. Directs the department to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary not later than September 15, 2026. Sunsets on January 2, 2027.

**Bill #: SB 282** Title: Environmental Health Study

Subject: Environment  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Health Care.

Digest: The Act would tell the OHA to study environmental health. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.3). Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study environmental health. Directs the authority to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the environment no later than September 15, 2026. Sunsets on January 2, 2027.

**Bill #: SB 298** Title: Energy Development Tax Incentives

Subject: Finance & Tax  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Finance and Revenue, then Ways and Means.

Digest: The Act would have LRO study tax incentives for energy development, storage and transmission in this state. The Act would require a report to be turned in next year. (Flesch Readability Score: 69.5). Requires the Legislative Revenue Officer to study tax incentives for energy development, storage and transmission in Oregon. Directs the officer to submit a report to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to revenue no later than September 15, 2026. Sunsets on January 2, 2027. Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Bill #: SB 301** Title: Boat Bill

Subject: Environment  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Possible Work Session scheduled.

Digest: The Act tells the State Marine Board to study boat safety. The Act tells the board to make a report on the results of the study. (Flesch Readability Score: 86.2). Requires the State Marine Board to study issues related to the safe operation of motorboats. Directs the board to submit findings to the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative Assembly not later than September 15, 2026. Sunsets January 2, 2027.

**Bill #: SB 330** Title: Placement of Utility Lines

Subject: Water  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Possible Work Session scheduled.

Digest: Directs the PUC to adopt standards to require that power lines be placed underground. Provides for exceptions. (Flesch Readability Score: 63.8). Directs the Public Utility Commission to adopt standards requiring the underground placement of electric power lines. Provides for exceptions.

**Bill #: SB 333** Title: Predator Damage Control Districts

Subject: General Gov  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Natural Resources and Wildfire.

Digest: The Act would let owners of land form a district in order to pay the costs to the county of staving off damage to their land caused by predators, by both nonlethal and lethal means. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.1). Authorizes landowners who meet certain criteria to petition for formation of a predator damage control district as a funding mechanism to pay the actual costs to the county of preventing, reducing and mitigating damage to property from predatory animals. Defines "prevent, reduce and mitigate damage to property from predatory animals" to include both nonlethal and lethal methods of prevention, reduction and mitigation. Establishes presumptive charges of \$2 per acre for tax lots of 10 or more acres and a \$50 flat rate charge for tax lots of less than 10 acres. Creates a cause of action under the district program for counties, landowners, districts and cities involved in the program. Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Bill #: SB 338** Title: Marine Sanctuary Approval

Subject: Ports  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Rules.

Digest: This Act tells the Gov. to tell a U.S. official that a marine sanctuary in this state will not be accepted unless the legislature signs off on it. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.5). Requires the Governor to certify to the United States Secretary of Commerce that the designation of a national marine sanctuary located within the seaward boundary of Oregon is unacceptable unless the Legislative Assembly confirms the designation.

**Bill #: SB 344** Title: Wildfire RC Subject: Public Safety  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Natural Resources and Wildfire, then Judiciary, then Ways and Means.

Digest: This Act tells the Attorney General to sue the U.S. government if some wildfires that cause bad air quality start on U.S. land. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.7).  
Directs the Department of Environmental Quality to notify the Attorney General if the air quality index readings for an area of the state reach 250 or higher during seven consecutive days and the cause is believed to be a wildfire originating on lands owned by the United States.  
Directs the Attorney General to investigate and bring a civil action if the wildfire was caused by negligent or unlawful forest management practices.

**Bill #: SB 346** Title: Wildfire Pilot Program Subject: Public Safety  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Natural Resources and Wildfire, then Ways and Means.

Digest: The Act tells an agency to create a pilot grant program for managing wildfire risk. The Act gives money for the program. (Flesch Readability Score: 76.4).  
Directs the State Forestry Department to establish by rule a pilot grant program for the purpose of managing wildfire risk by certain methods.  
Sunsets the grant program on June 30, 2027.  
Appropriates moneys to the department out of the General Fund for the purpose of funding the grant program.  
Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Bill #: SB 354** Title: Beaver Relocation Subject: Environment  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Public Hearing held.

Digest: The Act changes a program for voluntarily moving beavers. The Act makes the voluntary program include moving beavers from one part of this state to a different part of this state. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.1).  
Directs the State Department of Fish and Wildlife to include the relocation of beavers from western Oregon to central and eastern Oregon in a program for voluntarily relocating beavers.

**Bill #: SB 356** Title: Invasive Species Council Subject: Environment  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Natural Resources and Wildfire, then Ways and Means.

Digest: The Act gives money to the Invasive Species Council. The Act describes how the money must be used. (Flesch Readability Score: 80.2).  
Appropriates moneys to the Invasive Species Council, out of the General Fund, for certain purposes.  
Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

**Bill #: SB 357** Title: Ports RC Subject: Ports  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Public Hearing held.

Digest: The Act allows ports to charge for the costs of removing sediment. (Flesch Readability Score: 69.9).  
Authorizes ports to assess public bodies for a portion of the costs of removing sediment from port waters.

**Bill #: SB 359** Title: Impacts of homeless camping Subject: Environment  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Energy and Environment.

Digest: This Act says that any person can file a complaint for the DEQ to take action if homeless persons are putting waste into state waters. (Flesch Readability Score: 63.0).  
Authorizes any person to submit a complaint to the Department of Environmental Quality if the person reasonably believes that a camping site of homeless individuals is causing the discharge of wastes into state waters.  
Directs the department to remove individuals from the camping site and clean the camping site as necessary to protect state waters.  
Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Bill #: SB 360** Title: Battery operated pesticide application Subject: Environment  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Effective on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Digest: This Act allows some workers to apply pesticides without a license if they use a device that runs on a battery. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.6).  
Creates a pesticide licensing exemption for certain employees using a battery-powered device to apply pesticides.  
Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Bill #: SB 362**      Title: Water RC      Subject: Water  
Position:      Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Natural Resources and Wildfire.

Digest: The Act tells an agency to study rules about water. The Act tells the agency to report on the study. (Flesch Readability Score: 74.0).  
Directs the Water Resources Department to study rules related to water. Directs the department to submit a report to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to natural resources not later than September 15, 2026.

**Bill #: SB 365**      Title: Wildfire RC      Subject: Public Safety  
Position:      Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Natural Resources and Wildfire, then Ways and Means.

Digest: The Act tells the Attorney General to help someone whose wine grapes were hurt by wildfire smoke. (Flesch Readability Score: 70.1).  
Directs the Attorney General to assist a person in recovering damages from the federal government when smoke from a wildfire on federal lands causes damages to the person's wine grape growing.

**Bill #: SB 369**      Title: CPP Legislative Approval      Subject: Environment  
Position:      Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Energy and Environment.

Digest: The Act stops state agencies from doing things to reduce or stop greenhouse gases from entering the air in Oregon. (Flesch Readability Score 63.8).  
Prohibits the Governor and specified state agencies from taking measures to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in Oregon unless authorized by the Legislative Assembly by law enacted on or after the effective date of the Act.  
Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Bill #: SB 387**      Title: Disabled Vet P Tax Exemption      Subject: Finance & Tax  
Position:      Staff: HW

Status: Work Session scheduled.

Digest: The Act would grant higher property tax breaks for disabled veterans and their spouses if they survive them. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.6).  
Grants higher property tax exemptions for the property of veterans with disabilities. Grants exemptions for a veteran's surviving spouse who remains unmarried.  
Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Bill #: SB 394**      Title: CAT Tax Revenue for PERS      Subject: PERS  
Position:      Staff: HW

Status: Referred to Finance and Revenue.

Digest: The Act says that moneys from the CAT tax go to PERS to pay down the UAL, instead of to the Fund for Student Success, for 10 years. (Flesch Readability Score: 78.7).  
Provides that, for 10 years, revenues from the corporate activity tax are transferred to the Public Employees Retirement Fund for payment of the unfunded actuarial liability of the Public Employees Retirement System, instead of to the Fund for Student Success.

**Bill #: SB 397**      Title: Employer Time Rounding      Subject: Labor  
Position:      Staff: ML

Status: Public Hearing held.

Digest: The Act changes laws with respect to employer time-clock rounding policies. The Act allows such practices to the extent they comply with federal law. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.7).  
Provides that laws regarding employee entitlements for recovery of unpaid wages and penalties do not apply to wages and penalties lost as a result of an employer's time-rounding policies that comply with federal rounding standards.

**Bill #: SB 398**      Title: GHG Fees for Transpo      Subject: Transportation  
Position:      Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Finance and Revenue.

Digest: This Act says that fees from programs to reduce greenhouse gas must go to the State Highway Fund. (Flesch Readability Score: 85.1).  
Requires state agencies that administer programs to reduce greenhouse gas emissions to deposit fees, assessments or other charges imposed pursuant to the program in the State Highway Fund.  
Directs the Governor to include in the Governor's budget an estimate of the amounts to be transferred in the coming biennium and recommendations for alternative revenue sources.  
Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

**Bill #: SB 400**      Title: Removal-Fill Permit Exemption      Subject: General Gov  
Position:      Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Natural Resources and Wildfire.

Digest: This Act exempts removal or fill projects from needing a DSL permit if they get a permit from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. (Flesch Readability Score: 62.6).  
Exempts removal-fill projects from the requirement to obtain a permit from the Department of State Lands if the person is required to and does obtain a permit from the United States Army Corps of Engineers.  
Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

**Bill #: SB 403**      Title: Postmarked Ballot Repeal      Subject: Elections  
Position:      Staff: HW

Status: Referred to Rules.

Digest: The Act requires ballots that are returned by mail to be received by the date of the election. (Flesch Readability Score: 72.5).  
Requires that ballots that are returned by mail must be received by the date of the election.

**Bill #: SB 409**      Title: Carbon Sequestration      Subject: Environment  
Position:      Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Energy and Environment.

Digest: This Act says that the state will use carbon stored in land and water when calculating the state greenhouse gas emissions reduction goals. (Flesch Readability Score: 62.1).  
Declares that the policy of this state is to include atmospheric carbon sequestered by the lands and waters of this state in any calculation to determine progress toward the greenhouse gas emissions reduction goals.

**Bill #: SB 415**      Title: Zero Emission Incentives      Subject: Environment

Status: Referred to Transportation.

Digest: This Act tells the DEQ to study and make a report on incentives for vehicles with zero emissions. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.6).  
Requires the Department of Environmental Quality to study zero-emission vehicle incentives. Directs the department to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the environment no later than September 15, 2026.  
Sunsets on January 2, 2027.

**Bill #: SB 423**      Title: Cash Payment Penalties      Subject: Retail  
Position:      Staff: ML

Status: Public Hearing Scheduled.

Digest: The Act makes BOLI study issues about penalties for violating certain laws that require certain places to accept cash as payment for goods and services. The Act tells BOLI to submit a report by a certain date. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.0).  
Requires the Bureau of Labor and Industries to study matters relating to penalties for violating requirements to accept cash as currency in places of public accommodation. Directs the bureau to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to business and labor not later than September 15, 2026.  
Sunsets on January 2, 2027.

**Bill #: SB 425**      Title: Merchant Fees      Subject: Retail  
Position:      Staff: ML

Status: Public Hearing held.

Digest: Says that a merchant cannot charge a fee to use a credit card or debit card if the merchant does not accept cash. (Flesch Readability Score: 76.8).  
Prohibits a merchant from charging or collecting a fee for a person's use of a credit card or debit card in payment for goods or services if the merchant does not accept payment for the goods or services in cash.

Digest: The Act creates an advice group to review rural fire services and give advice on funding. The Act starts when signed and sunsets on 1/2/2027. (Flesch Readability Score: 74.0).  
[Digest: The Act would require a study of the revenue of rural fire protection districts in this state. The Act would require a report to be submitted next year. (Flesch Readability Score: 71.7).]  
[Requires the Legislative Revenue Officer to study the revenue of rural fire protection districts in this state. Directs the officer to submit a report to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to revenue no later than September 15, 2026.]  
Requires the Department of the State Fire Marshal to establish an advisory committee to advise the department on funding for rural fire protection districts. Directs the advisory committee to conduct a review of specified topics and develop recommendations for funding rural fire protection districts to ensure adequate and sustainable services. Requires the advisory committee to report to the Legislative Assembly on or before December 31, 2026.  
Sunsets on January 2, 2027.  
Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

**Bill #: SB 455** Title: Forest Trust Lands Subject: General Gov  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Energy and Environment.

Digest: The Act tells an agency to study the economic effects of a conservation plan. The Act tells the agency to report on the study. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.7).  
Directs the State Forestry Department to study the economic effects of a certain habitat conservation plan. Directs the department to report to committees or interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to natural resources no later than September 15, 2026.

**Bill #: SB 457** Title: Transient Lodging Taxes RC Subject: Finance & Tax  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Finance and Revenue.

Digest: The Act would require a study of how to allow local taxing districts to spend transient lodging tax moneys for public safety programs. The Act would require a report to be turned in next year. (Flesch Readability Score: 68.2).  
Requires the Legislative Revenue Officer to study the inclusion of public safety programs as tourism promotion for purposes of transient lodging tax expenditures. Directs the officer to submit a report to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to revenue no later than September 15, 2026.  
Sunsets on January 2, 2027.

**Bill #: SB 460** Title: Prevailing Wage Modifications Subject: Public Contracting  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Possible Work Session scheduled.

Digest: Says that laws that require paying a certain wage rate for workers on public works do not apply to a worker who is not yet a fully skilled worker. (Flesch Readability Score: 66.5).  
Exempts workers on public works who are participants in a pre-apprenticeship program from the application of laws that determine and require payment of a prevailing rate of wage.  
Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Bill #: SB 462** Title: Land Use Planner Education Subject: Land Use  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Public Hearing held.

Digest: This Act makes Business Oregon create a required course for land use planners. (Flesch Readability Score: 69.9).  
Requires the Oregon Business Development Department to establish an education course for land use planners for local governments, special districts and state agencies. Requires completion of the course at least once every two years.

**Bill #: SB 463** Title: Insurance Fund Solvency Subject: Insurance  
Position: Staff: HW

Status: Effective date, June 9, 2025.

Digest: Tells a state agency to do a report about how well the state's Insurance Fund is doing. (Flesch Readability Score: 70.1).  
Requires the Oregon Department of Administrative Services to submit by January [15] 31 of each even-numbered year a report to the Legislative Assembly concerning the soundness of the state's Insurance Fund. Specifies the contents of the report and directs agencies of state government and participants in the fund to cooperate with and assist the department in carrying out the department's duties under the Act.  
Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

**Bill #: SB 464** Title: Housing RC Subject: Housing  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Housing and Development.

Digest: This Act allows an owner a separate approval path for changes made to a home. (Flesch Readability Score: 67.5).  
Requires local governments to approve alteration, restoration or replacement of dwellings under an alternative process that is not a land use decision.

**Bill #: SB 471** Title: EBike Operations Subject: Transportation  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Judiciary.

Digest: The Act says that people may not ride Class 3 e-bikes on bike lanes, sidewalks or bike paths under the OVC. (Flesch Readability Score: 80.7).  
Prohibits operating a Class 3 electric assisted bicycle on a sidewalk, bicycle lane or bicycle path.

**Bill #: SB 473** Title: Public Official Crime Subject: General Gov  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Motion to refer to Rules carried. Referred.

Digest: The Act makes it a crime for a person who has been convicted of menacing a public official to have a gun. The Act goes into effect when the Governor signs it. (Flesch Readability Score: 74.2).  
[Digest: The Act creates a new crime of threatening a public official. The Act goes into effect when the Governor signs it. (Flesch Readability Score: 75.3).]  
[Creates the crime of threatening a public official. Punishes by a maximum of 364 days' imprisonment, \$6,250 fine, or both, for the first offense, and a maximum of five years' imprisonment, \$125,000 fine, or both, for subsequent offenses.]  
Prohibits the possession of a firearm by a person convicted of menacing a public official. Punishes the unlawful possession by a maximum of 364 days' imprisonment, \$6,250 fine, or both. Specifies procedures for the court to follow concerning the prohibition and a process for the person to surrender firearms.  
Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

**Bill #: SB 475** Title: Overtime PERS Calculations Subject: PERS  
Position: Staff: HW

Status: Work Session scheduled.

Digest: The Act changes how overtime is used in OPSRP. (Flesch Readability Score: 84.9).  
Modifies how the overtime cap is calculated for use in calculating the final average salary of members of the Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan.

**Bill #: SB 479** Title: Sewage Connection distance

Subject: Wastewater  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Natural Resources and Wildfire.

Digest: This Act says that DEQ may not find that a sewer is available to a property unless it is less than 200 feet from the property. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.0).  
Prohibits the Department of Environmental Quality from determining, for purposes of issuing a sewage disposal construction permit, that a community or area-wide sewerage system is available unless the sewerage system is within 200 feet of the property to be served.  
Sunsets January 2, 2031.  
Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Bill #: SB 482** Title: Administrative Rules RC

Subject: General Gov  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Rules.

Digest: The Act says that an agency may not make rules without statutory authority to make the rules. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.1).  
Provides that a state agency may not adopt rules without statutory authority.

**Bill #: SB 493** Title: Opioid Medicine EMR EMT

Subject: Public Safety  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Public Hearing held.

Digest: The Act says an EMR and an EMT can draw up and give doses of a drug to stop an opioid overdose. (Flesch Readability Score: 80.7).  
Allows an emergency medical responder and an emergency medical technician to draw up and administer one or more doses of a short-acting opioid antagonist from a container that contains multiple doses of the short-acting opioid antagonist.  
Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

**Bill #: SB 499** Title: Manufactured Dwellings Replacement

Subject: Housing  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Public Hearing held.

Digest: This Act provides money to replace old mobile homes in SW Oregon. (Flesch Readability Score: 67.7).  
Appropriates moneys to the Housing and Community Services Department to replace manufactured dwellings in specified counties.

**Bill #: SB 500** Title: Affordable Housing Tax Incentives

Subject: Finance & Tax  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Public Hearing held.

Digest: The Act makes a new tax credit for building affordable houses. (Flesch Readability Score: 64.9).  
Allows a new income or corporate excise tax credit for a portion of the eligible costs of a newly constructed single-family dwelling that sells for a price that is affordable to a household with an annual income at or below 120 percent of the area median income.  
Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Bill #: SB 501** Title: Standing in Land Use Appeals

Subject: Land Use  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Housing and Development.

Digest: This Act limits the appeal of a land use dispute to nearby opponents of the project who went to a hearing. (Flesch Readability Score: 68.9).  
Limits standing in appeals of land use decisions or limited land use decisions to persons that reside or maintain a business in or within 25 miles of a boundary of local government or special district and appeared before a decision maker in person at a hearing, if available.

**Bill #: SB 504** Title: Coastal Resources Bioengineering

Subject: Ports  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Recommendation: Do pass with amendments to the A-Eng. bill. (Printed B-Eng.)

Digest: This Act makes LCDC, ODSL and OPRD adopt rules for nature-based solutions to protect the coast. (Flesch Readability Score: 63.6).  
Requires the Land Conservation and Development Commission to adopt rules by January 1, 2028, to provide guidance on nonstructural, nature-based solutions for shoreline stabilization. Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Department of Land Conservation and Development for the purpose of adopting rules. Allows the Department of State Lands and the State Parks and Recreation Department to adopt conforming rules by January 1, 2029.



**Bill #: SB 505** Title: Co Emergency Mgmt Grants Subject: Public Safety  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Ways and Means by order of the President.

Digest: The Act tells ODEM to give grants to counties to pay for emergency coordinators. The Act tells the EPAC to make a group to study the emergency readiness of counties. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.8).  
Directs the Oregon Department of Emergency Management to develop and implement a grant program to distribute moneys to certain counties to fund emergency preparedness coordinators.  
Directs the Emergency Preparedness Advisory Council to convene a Committee on County Emergency Management to study and make recommendations regarding the capacity of counties in Oregon to prepare for, respond to and recover from emergencies.

**Bill #: SB 509** Title: Clean Truck CARB Preemption Subject: Transportation  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Energy and Environment.

Digest: This Act stops the EQC from adopting, and stops the DEQ from enforcing, California rules that require some trucks sold in the state to have no emissions. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.3).  
Prohibits the Environmental Quality Commission from adopting motor vehicle emission standards to implement California standards requiring that some or all medium- or heavy-duty vehicles sold in the state be zero-emission vehicles. Prohibits the Department of Environmental Quality from enforcing such standards adopted prior to the effective date of the Act.

**Bill #: SB 511** Title: Salmon Habitat Restoration Credits Subject: Environment

Digest: This Act tells the DSL to make a pilot program for owners of land to restore salmon habitat. (Flesch Readability Score: 71.0).  
Directs the Department of State Lands, in consultation with the State Department of Fish and Wildlife, to develop a salmon credit pilot program to encourage the voluntary restoration of salmonid habitat in the Coquille and Coos watershed basins.  
Establishes the Salmon Credit Trust Fund.  
Directs the Department of State Lands and the State Department of Fish and Wildlife to consult with the United States Army Corps of Engineers to develop or identify an existing programmatic general permit to authorize restoration activities under the pilot program.  
Becomes operative on the date that a programmatic general permit is established.  
Provides that the Department of State Lands may not approve a salmon credit project on or after January 2 of the sixth year following the establishment of a programmatic general permit.  
Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Bill #: SB 514** Title: Post Wildfire water quality Subject: Water  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Natural Resources and Wildfire, then Ways and Means.

Digest: The Act tells agencies to study how wildfire affects water quality. The Act tells the agencies to report on the study. (Flesch Readability Score: 63.2).  
Requires the State Department of Fish and Wildlife and Department of Environmental Quality to study the impacts of wildfire on water quality of streams and tributaries. Directs the departments to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to water not later than September 15, 2026.  
Sunsets January 2, 2027.

**Bill #: SB 518** Title: 3% for A&T Funding Subject: Finance & Tax  
Position: Staff: HW

Status: Referred to Finance and Revenue.

Digest: The Act would have a county at high risk of financial distress hold back three percent of property taxes to be used to fund the work of the county assessor. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.7).  
Authorizes a county tax collector to withhold from property tax distributions to taxing districts within the county an amount equal to three percent of the distributions. Applies during any period in which the county is listed in an audit report of the Secretary of State as being at high risk of financial distress. Allows a disabled member of the system to receive certain earned income without losing disability benefits.  
Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

Digest: Tells a state agency to study how to make housing more affordable for some people. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.8). Requires the Housing and Community Services Department to study affordable housing. Directs the department to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to affordable housing not later than September 15, 2026. Sunsets on January 2, 2027.

**Bill #: SB 601** Title: Affordable Housing RC

Status: Referred to Housing and Development.

Digest: This Act requires OHCS to study low-cost housing. (Flesch Readability Score: 71.8). Requires the Housing and Community Services Department to study affordable housing and submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to housing no later than September 15, 2026.

**Bill #: SB 606** Title: Health Care PTSD Presumption

Digest: The Act would add certain health care workers to those whose stress disorders give rise to a presumption that a workers' comp claim is compensable. (Flesch Readability Score: 63.0). Adds certain health care employees to the list of workers for whom certain stress disorders give rise to a presumption that a workers' compensation claim is compensable as an occupational disease.

**Bill #: SB 613** Title: Pay Equity Repeal

Status: Referred to Labor and Business.

Digest: The Act repeals certain provisions from the pay equity law. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.3). Modifies pay equity requirements for employers. Removes certain provisions relating to obligations, rights and remedies under pay equity laws. Makes conforming amendments. Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

**Bill #: SB 614** Title: Liability Waiver for Recreation

Subject: General Gov  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Judiciary.

Digest: The Act lets a person offering some dangerous sports make a patron sign a release of claims. (Flesch Readability Score: 70.1). Allows an operator offering or providing facilities for an inherently dangerous sporting activity to require a patron to provide an anticipatory release from certain claims for liability, including claims arising out of the negligence of the operator and claims for unreasonable conditions created by the operator. Provides that the release is not unconscionable. Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

**Bill #: SB 616** Title: Preservation of Trees

Status: Referred to Housing and Development.

Digest: This Act stops a city from limiting home building for tree preservation. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.7). Prohibits a local government from conditioning the development or use of property for needed housing based on the retention of trees. Provides exceptions. Sunsets January 1, 2036.

**Bill #: SB 624** Title: Grant Reporting Requirements

Digest: The Act says that groups that get money from the state must report on how they spent the money and on any political contributions they made. (Flesch Readability Score: 63.3). Directs state agencies to notify recipients of the requirements of the Act. Requires persons required to file reports under the Act to disclose amounts and recipients of political contributions made within a specified time frame. Requires public employers to conduct an annual training related to veterans' employment preferences. Provides that conducting an approved annual training is an affirmative defense to a claim for violation of veterans' employment preference statutes.

Requires the Oregon Business Development Department to study the use of a loan loss reserve fund to support infrastructure improvement projects by underserved communities in Oregon and submit a report to the legislature by September 15, 2026.

**Bill #: SB 760** Title: Fire Safety in Public Buildings

Status: Public Hearing Scheduled.

Digest: Makes new rules about fire safety systems in public buildings. Sets penalties. Takes effect on the 91st day after the session ends. (Flesch Readability Score: 68.6).  
Requires the owner of a public building to periodically conduct inspections and testing of fire dampers, smoke dampers, combination fire and smoke dampers and smoke control systems in the public building. Specifies qualifications for inspectors. Requires an inspector to issue a certificate of compliance if the public building complies with the applicable standards or to issue a deficiency report if the public building does not comply. Specifies a time period within which the public building owner must return the public building to compliance.  
Directs a building owner that receives public moneys for the purpose of replacing or repairing fire dampers, smoke dampers, combination fire and smoke dampers and smoke control systems to require a contractor to provide certain benefits to workers in connection with an installation or repair of equipment that fails an inspection or test or is otherwise deficient.  
Punishes violation of the Act with a civil penalty equivalent to five cents for each square foot of occupied space in the public building. Authorizes additional civil penalties for a continuing failure to comply.  
Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Bill #: SB 761** Title: Walla Walla Basin

Subject: Water  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Effective date, January 1, 2026.

Digest: The Act allows WRD to say yes to a temporary lease of existing water rights to become in-stream water rights, if WRD finds certain facts and conditions. The Act sunsets on Jan. 1, 2030. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.1).  
[Digest: The Act gives money to WRD for projects in the Walla Walla basin. (Flesch Readability Score: 76.5).]  
[Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Water Resources Department to implement projects that benefit water demands in the Walla Walla basin.]

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

**Bill #: SB 795** Title: Abandoned and derelict vessels

Status: Effective on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Digest: The Act changes laws about the cleanup of marine vessels that have been left alone or that are in bad shape. (Flesch Readability Score: 76.7).  
Modifies the meaning of terms used for purposes of the abandoned and derelict vessel laws.  
Clarifies that an authorized agency may remove and dispose of marine debris without notice.  
Creates the offense of abandoning a vessel. Punishes by a maximum fine of \$2,000. Expands the offense of possession of a derelict vessel.  
Authorizes the Director of the Department of State Lands to procure or supervise the procurement of goods, services and personal services related to the removal of abandoned and derelict vessels.  
Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Bill #: SB 800** Title: License tax compliance

Status: Public Hearing held.

Digest: The Act requires people who seek licenses to show tax compliance. (Flesch Readability Score: 64.9).  
Expands provisions requiring tax compliance as a condition of receiving a license to conduct a business, trade or profession or of entering into a contract with a state agency or political subdivision. Requires licensees and contractors to provide a tax compliance certificate from the Department of Revenue, unless a certain compliance rate is demonstrated by holders of the type of license.

Lets a person get out of a contract for landscape work on real property within three days even if the person does not own or lease the real property. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.5). Digest: This Act allows rural residents to build an extra house for their families. (Flesch Readability Score: 63.4). Allows an occupying homeowner outside of an urban growth boundary to site one additional family dwelling unit on the tract of the home. Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Bill #: SB 885** Title: SAIF Fire Policies Subject: Insurance

Digest: Tells a state agency to make fire insurance and property insurance available to people in this state to protect against wild fires. Sets up a fund for this purpose. Sunsets on January 2, 2027.

**Bill #: SB 903** Title: Pay Equity Bonuses

Status: Referred to Labor and Business.

Digest: The Act requires BOLI to study certain issues about pay equity. The Act requires BOLI to submit a report by a certain date. (Flesch Readability Score: 62.7).  
Requires the Bureau of Labor and Industries to study issues regarding the payment of certain bonuses under the pay equity law. Directs the bureau to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to business and labor not later than September 15, 2026.

Digest: The Act would let school districts apply to be exempt from the law that requires self-insured employers to submit proof that they will be able pay workers' comp claims. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.7).  
Includes school districts among the self-insured employers that may apply for exemption from the rules requiring such employers to demonstrate financial viability and provide security to the Director of the Department of Consumer and Business Services.

**Bill #: SB 906** Title: Pay Stubs

Digest: The Act makes new laws that require employers to explain certain details about employee pay stubs. The Act tells BOLI to make a sample document for employers to use to explain those details. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.9).  
[Digest: The Act makes new requirements for employee pay stubs. (Flesch Readability Score: 66.1).]  
[Requires that itemized statements provided to employees show, in plain language, the amount and purpose of each deduction.]  
Requires employers to provide to all employees, at the time of hire, a written explanation of earnings and deductions shown on itemized statements. Describes the ways in which an employer may satisfy the requirement. Establishes specifications for the contents of the written explanation. Requires employers to review and update the information provided in the written explanation by January 1 of each year. Directs the Bureau of Labor and Industries to develop and make available to employers a model written guidance document in English and in Spanish and, if requested, in other languages, to the extent practicable.

**Bill #: SB 916** Title: Strike Unemployment

Subject: Labor  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Speaker signed.

Digest: The Act would repeal the law that denies UI benefits to a person who is unemployed due to an active labor dispute. The Act would make it so that striking workers have an extra unpaid week before they qualify for benefits, which are subject to a possible limit based on the UI tax schedule at the time. The Act would require benefits to be paid back if they are overpaid due to the worker's later receipt of back pay. The Act would make a school district deduct from a worker's future wages benefits charged for weeks during a labor dispute. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.3).  
Provides that an individual otherwise eligible for unemployment insurance benefits is not disqualified for any week that the individual's unemployment is due to a labor dispute in active progress at the individual's place of employment. Provides that individuals unemployed due to a strike are disqualified for benefits for one week before eligibility begins, with the usual unpaid waiting week, subject to a [possible] limit based on the tax schedule in effect at the time. Provides for the collection of benefits overpaid during a strike due to the later receipt of back pay. Requires a school district to deduct from an employee's future wages benefits charged for weeks during a labor dispute.

**Bill #:** SB 921      **Title:** Shipyard RC      **Subject:** Ports  
**Position:**      **Staff:** ML

**Status:** Referred to Ways and Means by order of the President.

**Digest:** This Act says that an agency may loan money to a port for shipyard repairs. (Flesch Readability Score: 78.8).  
 [Digest: This Act requires OBDD to study shipyards. (Flesch Readability Score: 78.8).]  
 [Requires the Oregon Business Development Department to study needed investments in shipyards. Directs the department to submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to economic development not later than September 15, 2026.]  
 [Sunsets on January 2, 2027.]  
 Authorizes the Oregon Infrastructure Finance Authority to approve a loan to the Oregon International Port of Coos Bay for shipyard repairs. Allocates moneys from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund for the purpose of making the loan.

**Bill #:** SB 928      **Title:** Forced Labor EVs      **Subject:** General Gov  
**Position:**      **Staff:** ML

**Status:** Referred to Labor and Business.

**Digest:** Tells a public body that buys electric cars or solar panels that it needs proof from the vendor that no forced labor was used in producing the car or panel. Specifies penalties for lying about the proof. (Flesch Readability Score: 66.8).  
 Requires public bodies that procure electric vehicles and solar photovoltaic energy systems to receive before entering a contract for the electric vehicle or solar photovoltaic energy system a certification from the manufacturer, distributor, vendor or supplier that the production, assembly, transportation or sale of the electric vehicle or solar photovoltaic energy system did not use or involve forced labor or oppressive child labor. Requires probative evidence to accompany the certification.  
 Provides that a person that supplies a certification that is false, materially misleading, illegitimate, untruthful, forged or substantially inaccurate is liable for a civil penalty of not more than \$10,000 or half of the price the public body paid for the electric vehicle or solar photovoltaic energy system. Subjects the public body to similar penalties for knowingly or intentionally accepting a certification that the public body knows is false, materially misleading, illegitimate, untruthful, forged or substantially inaccurate.  
 Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Bill #:** SB 941      **Title:** Land Supply RC      **Subject:** Land Use  
**Position:**      **Staff:** ML

**Status:** Referred to Housing and Development.

**Digest:** This Act requires DLCD to study the supply of land to build homes and grow businesses. (Flesch Readability Score: 68.9).  
 Requires the Department of Land Conservation and Development to study the supply of land to build homes and grow businesses and submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to land use no later than September 15, 2026.

**Bill #:** SB 946      **Title:** WBF for BOLI      **Subject:** Workers Comp  
**Position:**      **Staff:** HW

**Status:** Public Hearing and Possible Work Session scheduled.

**Digest:** The Act would let the duty-related costs of the head of BOLI be paid out of the Workers' Benefit Fund. (Flesch Readability Score: 68.0).  
 Authorizes the payment out of the Workers' Benefit Fund of the expenses of the Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries in carrying out the commissioner's statutory duties.

**Bill #:** SB 949      **Title:** Affordable Housing      **Subject:** Housing  
**Position:**      **Staff:** ML

**Status:** Referred to Ways and Means by prior reference.

**Digest:** The Act tells OHCS to give some money to SEI to build housing. (Flesch Readability Score: 96.0).  
 [Digest: The Act tells OHCS to start a project to build some mixed-use affordable housing. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.7).]  
 Directs the Housing and Community Services Department to [establish a project to] disburse moneys to Self Enhancement, Inc., to develop affordable housing [that integrates residential units with community services and commercial spaces in the Portland metropolitan area. Requires the department to annually report to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to housing on the project's progress].  
 Sunsets on January 2, [2030] 2028.  
 Declares an emergency, effective on [passage] July 1, 2025.



**Bill #: SB 952** Title: Congressional Vacancies Subject: Election  
Position: Staff: HW

Status: Effective date, January 1, 2026.

Digest: The Act requires the Governor to appoint a U.S. Senator when a vacancy happens in the office. The Act states when the appointment ends and when a special election must occur. (Flesch Readability Score: 62.8).  
Requires the Governor to appoint a United States Senator when a vacancy in the office occurs. Requires that the appointed Senator be of the same political party as the elected Senator who vacated the office. Prohibits the Governor from appointing the Governor to fill the vacancy.  
Requires the Governor to call a special election within a specified period after the vacancy occurs. Requires the appointment to end when a replacement is elected.

**Bill #: SB 954** Title: Penalties for fires Subject: Public Safety  
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Judiciary.

Digest: The Act increases the penalties for causing fires. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.2).  
Increases the penalties for unlawfully causing fires. Punishes a first violation by a maximum of 30 days' imprisonment, a \$1,250 fine, or both. Punishes a second violation by a maximum of six months' imprisonment, a \$2,500 fine, or both. Punishes a third violation, or a first violation that proximately causes human injury, loss of human life or property damage of \$10,000 or more, by a maximum of 364 days' imprisonment, a \$6,250 fine, or both.

Digest: This Act gives money to DAS to give a grant to Heard Farms for wastewater treatment infrastructure. (Flesch Readability Score: 60.6).  
Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services to provide a grant to Heard Farms to expand wastewater treatment infrastructure.  
Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

**Bill #: SB 958** Title: Land Outside UGBs Subject: Land Use

Status: Referred to Housing and Development.

Digest: This Act allows cities or counties to select land outside of the UGBs to site homes or light commercial uses. Lands are exempt from statewide land use laws. (Flesch Readability Score: 74.7).  
Allows cities or counties to designate lands outside the urban growth boundary for residential or light commercial use. Exempts designated lands from statewide land use planning laws.

**Bill #: SB 964** Title: Postal Indicators Subject: Elections

Digest: The Act defines a postmark for ballot envelopes. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.2).  
Defines "postal indicator" as an official mark stamped on an envelope by the United States Postal Service for purposes of determining the date or time at which a ballot was mailed.

Digest: The Act says that a person may not deliver the ballot of another person. The Act has exceptions. The Act imposes specified fines for a violation. (Flesch Readability Score: 61.3).

Authorizes local governments to enter into agreements governing local improvements proposed for unincorporated areas within [a city's] an urban growth boundary.

**Status:** Rules suspended. Carried over to June 23, 2025 Calendar.

**Digest:** The Act would make new laws for deductions from public employees' wages to recoup amounts that were paid in error. (Flesch Readability Score: 63.8).  
 Provides conditions and procedures under which a public employer may deduct amounts of erroneous overpayments from a public employee's wages.

**Bill #:** SB 974      **Title:** Land Use Review Timeline      **Subject:** Land Use
