

#### Bill #: HB 4001 Title: Essential Worker Pay

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Requires Director of Oregon Department of Administrative Services to study development and administration of program to make payments to essential workers for services performed during COVID-19 pandemic and report findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to labor on or before September 15, 2023. Sunsets January 2, 2024.

Title: Public Safety RC Bill #: HB 4008

Status: Chapter 40, (2022 Laws): Effective date March 23, 2022.

Authorizes Commission on Statewide Law Enforcement Standards of Conduct and Discipline to hire executive director and support staff, and to enter into interagency or intergovernmental agreement for provision of support staff. Corrects operative date section reference for certain existing provisions of law. Modifies provisions relating to use by law enforcement agencies of certain crowd management measures. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 4013 **Title: Utility Payments** 

Status: Chapter 42, (2022 Laws): Effective date June 3, 2022.

Directs Department of Education to establish pilot program in which certain school districts make one-time distributions to families of students to assist with unpaid rent, past-due utilities or move-in expenses.]

Modifies eligibility requirements for organizations that may receive grants from unaccompanied homeless youth grant program. Extends higher education tuition and fee waivers to current or former homeless youth. Extends independent residence facility eligibility to current or former homeless youth.

Directs Department of Human Services to submit to interim legislative committees recommendations for legislation to reduce numbers of youth experiencing homelessness.

Appropriates moneys to Department of Human Services for certain homeless youth programs. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 4014 Title: SDC Study

Status: Chapter 1, (2022 Laws): Effective date March 2, 2022.

Extends deadline for submission of final report based on study of system development charges required under section 1, chapter 544, Oregon Laws 2021 (Enrolled House Bill 3040). Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 4019 Title: QRF

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services to periodically conduct performance audit of public agencies to determine compliance with laws that require procurements from qualified nonprofit agencies for individuals with disabilities. Requires department to publish results of audit on department's website and to certify compliance or failure to comply. Permits department to impose fines for noncompliance.

Requires public agencies that terminate or decline to renew contracts with qualified nonprofit agencies for individuals with disabilities to require contractor to submit to department in writing detailed information about pay rate and benefits contractor provided to employees. Requires department to supervise transitions between contracts with qualified nonprofit agencies for individuals with disabilities that public agencies terminate or decline to renew and new contracts with successor service providers. Requires department to impose fines for failures to comply with or violations of requirements that apply to such transitions.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 4021 Title: Homestead Deferral

Status: Chapter 12, (2022 Laws): Effective date June 3, 2022.

Extends period in which taxpayers, upon transfer of ownership of homestead or moving manufactured structure or floating home out of state, may discontinue participation in homestead property tax deferral program in assessment year. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 4041Title: Structural Masonry

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Permits Building Codes Structures Board to adopt licensing standards for performing structural masonry. Permits Construction Contractors Board to adopt licensing standards for applying or installing fireproofing materials in essential facilities. Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to adopt rules to require adequate fireproofing in all newly constructed essential facilities. Specifies minimum provisions required in department's rules. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Reduces number of electors who must be registered as member of minor political party in order for minor political party to retain political party status from one-half of one percent to one-quarter of one percent of total number of registered electors in state.

Bill #: HB 4049 Title: Campaign Finance RC

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Requires Secretary of State to conduct study and analyze best practices for financing electoral campaigns. Requires secretary to develop recommendations regarding most effective method for financing electoral campaigns in Oregon. Requires secretary to submit report to interim legislative committees detailing recommendations by September 15, 2023. Sunsets January 2, 2024.

Bill #: HB 4050 Title: Public Safety RC

Status: Chapter 46, (2022 Laws): Effective date March 23, 2022.

Directs Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to study issues relating to public safety and report on results of study to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2023.] Directs Department of Corrections, in cooperation with Oregon Criminal Justice Commission, to establish pilot program to provide legal services that assist adults in custody who are serving sentences at Coffee Creek Correctional Facility. Directs commission to grant funds to Oregon Justice Resource Center for purposes of program. Directs commission and center to evaluate program and report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to corrections not later than September 15, 2023. Sunsets December 31, 2024. Declares emergency, effective on passage. Bill #: HB 4055 Title: Timber Tax Increase Subject: Finance & Tax

Status: Chapter 31, (2022 Laws): Effective date June 3, 2022.

Extends biennial privilege taxes on merchantable forest products harvested on forestlands.

Directs Legislative Assembly to use data from quarterly economic and revenue forecast released in February of each odd-numbered year when determining] begin considering biennial forest products harvest tax rates not later than March 10 of each odd-numbered year. Requires State Forestry Department to provide Legislative Revenue Officer or Legislative Fiscal Officer with timber harvest data upon request for purpose of determining biennial forest products harvest tax rates] such consideration.

Imposes additional privilege tax on merchantable forest products harvested on forestlands. Directs revenues to be used to fund mitigation of effects of forest practices on aquatic species. Makes additional privilege tax conditional and temporary and caps collections at \$250 million of revenue.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Adds "spray sprinkler bodies" to minimum energy efficiency standards. Adds "spray sprinkler bodies" to prohibition against sale or installation of products that do not meet minimum energy efficiency standards. Becomes operative January 1, 2023.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.



#### Bill #: HB 4059 Title: Project Labor Standards

Status: Chapter 51, (2022 Laws): Effective date March 23, 2022.

Redefines "large-scale project" as "covered project" for purposes of contractor labor standards. Clarifies application of labor standards based on project's capacity rating. Clarifies good faith exception to required total work hours performed by apprentices.

Modifies requirement of when person who constructs or repowers covered project shall provide signed attestation or declaration to within 30 days from date construction begins.

Exempts contracts and subcontracts with tribal government, agent or instrumentality of Oregon Indian tribe for covered project on tribal lands from contractor labor standards.

Requires request for proposals by electric company for resource procurement subject to competitive bidding requirements and that may result in procurement of covered project to include reference to and information regarding contractor labor standards and to require successful bidder to verify provision of attestation, declaration or project labor agreement. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 4060 **Title: Federal Funds** 

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Authorizes Sustainability Board to hire employees for specified purposes.] Directs Department of Transportation to establish program to provide administrative and technical assistance to certain entities in this state for activities related to certain federal funding opportunities. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Title: Cannabis Bill #: HB 4061

Status: Chapter 52, (2022 Laws): Effective date June 3, 2022.

Authorizes Water Resources Director to petition for warrant authorizing entry onto land or inspection.] Requires person that owns or operates place of use at which hauled water is used for irrigation, nursery or agricultural purposes, or that hauls water to be used for irrigation, nursery or agricultural purposes,] certain water suppliers to maintain certain records for at least 12 months and provide records to law enforcement or Water Resources Department upon request. Requires person that purchases water from water supplier at distribution location to be hauled for irrigation or nursery purposes

to keep certain records for at least 12 months and provide records to law enforcement or department upon request. Prohibits person that owns or operates place of use at which hauled water is used for irrigation, nursery or agricultural purposes from soliciting or accepting hauled water from illegal source] from hauling water to, or arranging for hauling of water to, certain grow sites. Provides that violation with criminal negligence under certain circumstances is subject to maximum penalty of 364 days' imprisonment, \$25,000 fine, or both.

Prohibits person from making false verbal or written statement or representation] willfully or negligently providing false information to law enforcement or department regarding hauled water or] hauling of water related to plants in plant Cannabis family Cannabaceae. Authorizes imposition of civil penalties for violation of requirements or prohibitions]. Provides that violation of false statement or representation prohibition is subject to maximum penalty of 364 days' imprisonment, \$25,000 fine, or both] is subject to maximum penalty of 364 days' imprisonment, \$6,250 fine, or both.

Instructs Water Resources Commission to notify certain violators of time allowed to correct violation within 10 business days after commission becomes aware of violation.

Provides that civil penalty for certain violations related to water resources may not exceed \$5,000 per day for each day of violation. Establishes exception for violation related to crop of plants in plant Cannabis family Cannabaceae, for which civil penalty may not exceed \$20,000 per day for each day of violation or economic value of crop, whichever is greater.] Instructs commission to consider value of any crop of plants in plant Cannabis family Cannabaceae to which certain violations may relate when imposing civil penalty for violation.]

Provides that certain violations related to water resources are Class A misdemeanors, that each day of violation constitutes separate offense and that maximum fine is \$25,000.]

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

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Authorizes State Department of Agriculture to establish by rule types or classes of licenses or certificates for persons using

### Bill #: HB 4063 Title: Substantial Completion

Subject: Housing Position: Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to enter into public contract to research and analyze administrative procedures for approving residential construction projects in this state and to develop recommendations, including recommendations for best practices, for reducing amount of time necessary for approval. Specifies requirements for method of conducting, and scope of information for inclusion in, contractor's research and analysis. Requires department to report each quarter on progress of research and analysis to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to housing, with initial report due not later than December 1, 2022. Modifies definition of "substantial completion" with respect to residential subdivisions to require construction of certain public

improvements under applicable conditions of development and to standards that city or county establishes or specifies by agreement with developer, declarant or owner.]

Adds to list of items that are necessary for substantial completion of residential subdivision off-site improvements for emergency services, water and storm water and sewage disposal at capacity that is sufficient to serve residential subdivision. Requires city or county to allow applications for building permits without regard to whether final plat is recorded.

Requires city or county to assign temporary addresses to lots in residential subdivision. Specifies basis for assignment and notifications required for changes.]

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 4064 **Title: Mobile Home Placement** Subject: Housing Staff: ML Position:

Status: Chapter 54, (2022 Laws): Effective date March 23, 2022.

Prohibits local governments from prohibiting siting of prefabricated structures in all residential zones. Expands eligibility for siting manufactured homes and prefabricated structures on lands zoned to allow single-family dwellings within urban growth boundary. Allows siting of prefabricated structures in mobile home or manufactured dwelling parks.

Limits improvements that landlord of manufactured dwelling park may require of tenant. Requires Attorney General to update model statement by January 1, 2023.

Expands eligibility for manufactured dwelling replacement program to allow owners of dwellings destroyed by natural disaster to replace outside of disaster area.

Updates certain definitions of manufactured dwellings and manufactured dwelling parks to include prefabricated structures. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 4066 Title: Veterans Preference Subject: Labor Position:

Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Provides that public employer may require veteran must] to provide evidence of eligibility for veterans' preference in public employment at time of application for civil service position. Provides that evidence may include any documentation demonstrating preference eligibility.

Modifies law relating to interviews of veterans for vacant civil service positions. Provides that public employer that does not interview veteran must provide written explanation of reasons for decision.

Permits disabled veteran or surviving spouse of deceased disabled veteran to use state park, individual campsite or day use fee area without charge.]

Directs Department of Veterans' Affairs to develop and implement programs that assist veterans to transition from military service to workforce or business community. Permits use of moneys in Veterans' Services Fund to develop, implement and maintain programs.]

Directs department to develop and implement programs that assist veterans to transition into or maintain stable housing. Permits use of moneys in Veterans' Services Fund to develop, implement and maintain programs.]

Requires department to report to Legislative Assembly regarding status of workforce and housing grant programs by September 15. 2024.1

Repeals sunset on Veteran Educational Bridge Grant Program.

Exempts members of Oregon National Guard from Oregon Promise eligibility requirement that applicant first accept federal aid grants available to person.]

Provides 100 percent property tax exemption for homestead or personal property of veteran aged 65 years or older with service-connected disabilities of 100 percent or more or surviving spouse of veteran who died from service-connected injury or illness or received at least one year of 100 percent exemption.]

Repeals partial exemption for homestead of surviving spouse of veteran of American Civil War or Spanish-American War.] Designates portion of U.S. Highway 30 as Oregon Veterans Memorial Highway.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 4087 **Title: Press Access** 

Status: Chapter 59, (2022 Laws): Effective date March 23, 2022.

Requires, on or after January 1, 2023, officials of public bodies to grant news media representatives access to scenes of wildfires or natural disasters on public lands that are otherwise closed to public. Provides exceptions when access may be denied or when access may be limited to news media representatives who have received basic fire and natural disaster site safety training approved by associations representing professional news media and public safety agencies. Authorizes on-site scene commanders or designees to grant unescorted access to scenes of wildfires or natural disasters to news media representatives who assume own risk and without promise of rescue. Provides that mandated news media access rules do not apply to property owned by specified educational institutions.

Directs Department of State Police] Office of Emergency Management to convene committee of equal numbers of news media and public safety agency stakeholders to develop voluntary guidelines for basic fire and natural disaster site safety training for news media representatives, examples of when circumstances warrant denial of access to news media representatives and other specified topics. Directs stakeholder committee designees to report on work of committee to House Interim Committee on Rules prior to September 1, 2022.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 4090 **Title: Diesel Vehicles** 

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Requires state contracting agency that procures or intends to procure vehicle with diesel motor or engine to qualify vehicle for procurement by obtaining certification from manufacturer or vendor of vehicle that diesel motor or engine is capable of operating with blended fuel that consists of not less than 20 percent biodiesel. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 4092 Title: Broadband Expansion

Status: Chapter 60, (2022 Laws): Effective date March 23, 2022.

Modifies composition and duties of Oregon Broadband Advisory Council. Provides for establishment of grant application review committees.

Directs Oregon Broadband Office to develop Broadband Action Plan and Digital Equity Plan that address requirements in Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act.

Directs Oregon Broadband Office to collect geospatial data information related to broadband service in Oregon to assist state to determine eligibility for grants and loans and confirm allocation of federal funds. Exempts from public disclosure proprietary information subject to nondisclosure agreement provided to office.

Establishes Connecting Oregon Libraries Fund. Continuously appropriates moneys in fund to State Library for purpose of providing matching funds for federal moneys received by certain libraries for providing broadband access. Requires State Library Board to adopt certain rules before distributing moneys in fund.

Directs Public Utility Commission, in consultation with certain other state agencies, to investigate and make recommendations on feasibility of expanding Oregon Telephone Assistance Program and applying residential service surcharge to support access to broadband Internet access service or other telecommunications services. Requires commission to submit report to appropriate regular or interim committee of Legislative Assembly and Oregon Broadband Office no later than June 1, 2023.

Removes requirement that Public Utility Commission serve notice of all filings of applications for certificates of authority to provide intrastate telecommunications services. Removes requirement that commission provide annual competitive provider report to Legislative Assembly.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 4095 Title: Veterans RC

Status: Chapter 61, (2022 Laws): Effective date June 3, 2022.

Establishes Veterans Dental Program in Oregon Health Authority to provide oral health care to low-income veterans who reside in Oregon beginning in 2023. Specifies eligibility requirements for program. Provides that character of discharge does not affect eligibility.

Directs Department of Veterans' Affairs to create criteria for waiver to eligibility requirement that veteran be discharged or released under honorable conditions when discharge or release is result of discriminatory policies or practices. Authorizes county or tribal veterans' service officer to grant waiver in accordance with department criteria.] Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 4097 Title: Firefighter Income Tax

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Establishes income tax credit for volunteer firefighters. Applies to tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2023, and before January 1, 2029. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

## Bill #: HB 4101 Title: Vape Distance 25 Feet

Subject: General Gov Position: Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Increases distance from certain parts of public places and places of employment within which person may not smoke, aerosolize or vaporize inhalant from 10 feet to 25 feet. Creates exception for public places and places of employment that hold specified licenses issued by Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission.

Directs Legislative Policy and Research Director to study use of impact statements in legislative deliberations and to report findings to Legislative Policy and Research Committee on or before February 1, 2023.] develop pilot racial and ethnic impact statement template containing specified items. Requires director, following conferral with Senate and House Interim Committees on Rules, to select six measures enacted during 2021 regular session, apply pilot template to all six measures and report findings, process and experience on preliminary basis to House Interim Committee on Rules. Permits director, following feedback provided by House Interim Committee on Rules, to modify template and then provide final impact statements and process report to Senate and House Interim Committees on Rules and to policy committees that had heard test measures during 2021 regular session.

Requires director, following presentations to interim committees, to propose policy to Legislative Policy and Research Committee that describes content, objectives and form of racial and ethnic impact statements. Requires committee to deliberate on, modify where appropriate, and adopt policy.

Requires director, for odd-numbered year regular sessions occurring in 2023 or later years, to prepare racial and ethnic impact statements on limited number of legislative measures within specified policy areas. Requires statements to be prepared in conformance with policy adopted by Legislative Policy and Research Committee.

Requires director, following completion of 2023 regular session, to report to House Interim Committee on Rules on racial and ethnic impact statement process. Authorizes committee to consider applying impact statement process to additional policy areas, even-numbered year regular sessions, special sessions and meetings of Emergency Board. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.]

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 4113 Title: Firefighter Cancer Presumption

Status: Chapter 8, (2022 Laws): Effective date January 1, 2023.

Adds to cancers covered by rebuttable presumption of occupational disease for eligible nonvolunteer firefighters. Requires Workers' Compensation Management-Labor Advisory Committee to review material published by National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health related to cancers associated with nonvolunteer firefighters.

Directs Institute for Natural Resources, in coordination with commission, to study workforce and economic development potential of strategies to increase net carbon sequestration and storage in natural and working lands and waters] and provide results to committees of Legislative Assembly related to environment no later than March] April 15, 2023. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: SB 1535 Title: Housing RC

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Directs Housing and Community Services Department to study issues relating to housing and to report to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly on or before September 15, 2023. Sunsets December 31, 2023.

Bill #: SB 1536 **Title: Warming & Cooling Shelters** 

Status: Governor signed.

Limits restrictions on portable cooling devices in residences by landlords, homeowners associations, condominium associations and local governments.

Directs Oregon Health Authority to create program to acquire air conditioners and air filters for distribution on emergency basis to eligible individuals. Appropriates moneys for program.

Requires that Housing and Community Services Department website contain list of dates where counties experienced extreme heat events and contain information for landlords regarding state programs and services that may help tenants meet cooling needs.

Requires new residential dwelling units to provide adequate cooling facilities. Requires rented spaces in facilities to provide adequate electrical service for tenant's reasonable heating and cooling uses for new manufactured dwellings and floating homes and for updated electrical connections.

Establishes Heat Pump Deployment Program within State Department of Energy to provide grants to entities to support purchase and installation of heat pumps and related upgrades. Establishes Heat Pump Deployment Advisory Council. Establishes Heat Pump Deployment Fund. Appropriates moneys for fund.

Authorizes State Department of Energy to make available for rental housing grants for upgrades to support cooling facilities and rebates for heat pump purchases and installations. Establishes Residential Heat Pump Fund. Requires department to provide grants to entity to assist landlords with creating or operating community cooling centers. Requires department to study cooling facilities for certain residential dwellings. Requires department to report on programs to interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2023. Appropriates moneys to department for fund and programs. Sunsets fund and programs on January 2, 2025. Expands Department of Human Services grant program for clean air shelters] spaces that provide cleaner air to include spaces

that provide warming and cooling shelters and facilities]. Appropriates moneys to department.

Adds Indian health center and manufactured dwelling park nonprofit cooperative to participants eligible for Healthy Homes Program grants. Makes heat reduction improvements and electrical upgrades eligible for program grants.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.



Bill #: SB 1545 Title: Governor Workforce Investment

Establishes grant programs in Higher Education Coordinating Commission to provide funding for workforce development activities that aim to increase access for priority populations to training opportunities in technology, health care and manufacturing and to workforce development services and benefits.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Higher Education Coordinating Commission to support grant programs. Establishes Prosperity 10,000 Program in Higher Education Coordinating Commission to be administered by local workforce development boards to provide workforce development services and wraparound supports to program participants. Requires Department of Human Services to incorporate program into statewide plan for SNAP Employment and Training Program and to seek federal reimbursement for percentage of program costs and other eligible activities.

seek federal reimbursement for percentage of program costs and other eligible activities. Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Higher Education Coordinating Commission, Department of Human Services and Oregon Health Authority for carrying out provisions relating to Prosperity 10,000 Program. Requires commission to distribute moneys appropriated to commission to local workforce development boards not later than 60 days following effective date of Act.

Requires Bureau of Labor and Industries to establish and administer grant program to provide financial support for development, expansion and implementation of registered apprenticeship and preapprenticeship training programs in specific industry sectors. Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Bureau of Labor and Industries to carry out provisions related to grant program. Requires Youth Development Division] Department of Education to develop grant program to award grants to entities that provide youth and young adults from priority populations with increased access to youth workforce programs that offer workforce readiness training and job placement services.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Youth Development Division] Department of Education to support grant program. Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission to establish program to convene industry consortia throughout state to increase training and career opportunities for priority populations.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Higher Education Coordinating Commission to support program activities. Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission to establish grant program to award grants to pilot projects brought by local workforce development boards that partner with comprehensive one-stop centers or community-based organizations that hire workforce benefits navigator.

Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission, in collaboration with State Workforce and Talent Development Board, Bureau of Labor and Industries and Youth Development Council, to review programs established under Act and submit report to Governor and interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to workforce development on performance and expenditure outcomes of programs.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: SB 1561 Title: Golden Campaign Finance

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Prohibits candidates for state office from accepting contributions in excess of amounts specified and from sources not specified. Prohibits certain political committees from accepting contributions in excess of amounts specified and from sources not specified.

Defines "small donor committee."

Establishes Grassroots Donor Election Program to enable candidates for defined state offices to receive specified match on small dollar donations. Limits matching funds.

Establishes Oregon Elections Commission to oversee Grassroots Donor Election Program. Specifies composition and duties of commission.

Repeals Ballot Measure 47 (2006), currently held in abeyance, which establishes limits on political campaign contributions and independent expenditures on candidate races and establishes certain campaign finance disclosure requirements. Becomes operative November 6, 2024.

Bill #: SB 1565 Title: Cash Transactions

Makes unlawful practice for place of public accommodation to refuse to accept United States coins or currency as payment for goods and services. Creates limited exceptions. Allows person to file complaint with Commissioner of Bureau of Labor and Industries alleging unlawful practice against operator or person acting on behalf of place of public accommodation. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.



## Bill #: SB 1567 Title: Fuel Farm

Requires owners or operators of bulk oils and liquid fuels terminals located in Columbia, Multnomah or Lane County to conduct and submit to Department of Environmental Quality seismic vulnerability assessments. Requires department to review and approve seismic vulnerability assessments. Requires owner or operator of existing bulk oils or liquid fuels terminal to submit seismic vulnerability assessment by June 1, 2024. Requires department to submit report on seismic vulnerability assessments and make recommendations on expansion of program to interim committees of Legislative Assembly by November 1, 2024. Requires owner or operator of bulk oils or liquid fuels terminal to properly implement seismic risk mitigation implementation plan approved by department. Directs Environmental Quality Commission to, by rule, adopt seismic risk mitigation implementation program for bulk oils or liquid fuels terminals.

Prohibits owner or operator of bulk oils or liquid fuels terminal from retaliating against employee who provides information regarding violation of law or safety risks.

Establishes Seismic Risk Mitigation Fund.

Requires State Department of Energy to develop energy security plan by June 1, 2024, and provide report on implementation or revision of plan to interim committees of Legislative Assembly by September 15 of each even-numbered year. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Clarifies prohibitions regarding provisions that may not be included in agreements between employers and former, current or prospective employees.

Establishes conduct that constitutes violation of prohibitions. Creates exemptions to prohibitions.

Allows recovery of civil penalties for certain violations.

Requires mediator in mediation concerning allegations of certain unlawful conduct to provide person who is party to mediation and who is not represented by attorney with copy of certain policies concerning prevention of certain unlawful conduct. Provides that mediation communications relating to certain allegations of misconduct are not confidential and may be admitted as evidence.]

Requires employers to provide copy of employer's written policies against unlawful discrimination and harassment to person with whom employer seeks to enter into certain agreements.
