Being prepared in the event of an accident or roadside emergency can save lives, lower the chances of injury, and make claims processes easier. This kit includes several items to help you mitigate risk if you ever experience one of these events. Included is a guide to managing accidents, a guide to managing roadside emergencies, "Ok" and "Help" roadside sign, and a DMV Traffic Accident and Insurance Report form.

This kit is only intended to help you navigate the circumstances of an accident or roadside emergency. If you are in a serious accident or life-threatening situation, always call 911.




-WHAT TO DO IN CASE OF AN ACCIDENT-

Safety first!

- If someone has been hurt, **dial 911** or ask someone to dial 911 for medical asisstance.
- Avoid discussing who is at blame or fault for the accident. Statements or comments should only be made to police or a representative of your insurance company.
- **Take Photos** of the accident scene--and damage to your vehicle.
- Exchange Information with the other driver(s) and take photos of their Driver License when possible (use form on back)
- Report the accident to your insurance company and/or agent
- Know when to fill out a **Traffic Accident and Insur**ance Report with the DMV (See included form)

What to do in case of an emergency

1. Pull as far and safetly off the road as possible

2. Turn on your hazard lights and lift your hood to signal for help

3. Use your cell phone to call for help. If anyone stops ask them to call on your behalf

4. If it's safe to stay in the vehicle, evaluate your surroundings and stay put until help arrives.
