

SDAO Legislative Bill Summary as of 03/23/20

Bill #: [HB 4007](#) Title: UI for Labor DisputesSubject: Labor
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Public Hearing and Possible Work Session scheduled.

Provides that individual otherwise eligible for unemployment insurance benefits is not disqualified for any week that individual's unemployment is due to labor dispute in active progress at individual's place of employment. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: [HB 4010](#) Title: Opportunity ZonesSubject: Eco Devo
Position: Staff: ML

Status: At Desk upon adjournment.

Requires taxpayer to increase basis of investment by 50 percent of difference between fair market value and original basis, at sale or exchange of investment in opportunity zone property held at least 10 years, in lieu of full fair market value basis allowed in federal law. Applies to tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2020. [Requires addition to federal taxable income of amounts excluded as gain attributable to investment in federal qualified opportunity zone. Allows subtraction in later tax year if gain is temporarily deferred at federal level.] Directs Legislative Revenue Officer, after study and consultation with interested parties, to report to Legislative Assembly on operation, benefits, impact and effectiveness of federal opportunity zone program in Oregon and to [make recommendations, if appropriate, for legislation intended to achieve partial reconnection] include recommended options, if appropriate, for legislation related to federal opportunity zone program in Oregon. [Applies to tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2020.] Requires each qualified opportunity fund in state to submit annual report to Department of Consumer and Business Services following receipt of moneys from investor by fund or investment by fund in qualified opportunity zone in state. Prescribes required information for inclusion in report. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Position: Staff: HW

Status: Referred to Revenue.

Directs Legislative Revenue Officer to report to Legislative Assembly on options for tax reform including recommendations for legislation intended to reform current tax system. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: [HB 4012](#) Title: Land Use Relating ClauseSubject: Land Use
Position: Staff: ML

Status: At Desk upon adjournment.

Requires Department of Land Conservation and Development to approve City of Bend's expansion of urban growth boundary, and allows department to approve other land use regulations for city on specified lands, if owner of land possesses development opportunity transferred from Metolius resort site owner and city meets other conditions. Sunsets provisions on January 2, [2027] 2030. Sunsets, on July 1, 2020, laws allowing Metolius resort site owners to use development opportunity to develop small-scale recreation communities. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: [HB 4014](#) Title: Land Use RCSubject: Land Use
Position: Staff: ML

Status: At Desk upon adjournment.

Exempts dog training facilities from state structural specialty codes. Provides that lawful units of land whose property lines are relocated by certain judgments remain lawful units. Prohibits requiring additional validating procedures or denying permits because of judicial boundary changes. Requires State Department of Energy to, no later than September 15, 2020, provide report to Legislative Assembly on disposal of radioactive waste in Oregon. Modifies definition of radioactive waste for purposes of regulation by State Department of Energy. Requires Energy Facility Siting Council to adopt standards and rules necessary to prevent disposal of radioactive waste in Oregon. Provides Director of State Department of Energy and Energy Facility Siting Council additional authority for administration and enforcement of laws related to disposal of radioactive waste. Authorizes county to allow owner of lot or parcel within rural residential zone to construct one accessory dwelling unit on lot or parcel, subject to certain restrictions. Specifies that single-family dwelling and accessory dwelling on same lot or parcel are considered single unit for purposes of calculating exemptions from ground water rights requirements. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: [HB 4015](#) Title: Housing Relating ClauseSubject: General Gov
Position: Staff: ML

Status: At Desk upon adjournment.

[Directs Housing and Community Services Department to study laws related to housing and to report to Legislative

Assembly no later than September 15, 2020.] Authorizes Housing and Community Services Department to grant moneys to nonprofit organization for ADU community pilot programs that develop accessory dwelling units that are for income-eligible homeowners or available for rent by income-eligible tenants. Requires department to report on ADU community pilot programs to interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2023. Appropriates moneys for grant to be awarded to Hacienda Community Development Corporation. Requires cities within Metro with population greater than 10,000 to conduct housing needs analysis. Replaces requirement that Metro allocate housing capacity among those cities with requirement that cities amend their land use regulations and housing production strategy if analysis shows housing need. Extends date by which Land Conservation and Development Commission must adopt schedule for housing needs analyses to December 31, 2020. Expands allowable uses of specific department appropriation to allow provision of technical assistance to local governments to increase housing affordability and availability. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 4017 Title: Speed Bump Relating Clause

Subject: Transportation

Status: Public Hearing held.

Requires Department of Transportation to study development of uniform standards for speed bump height and markings. Sunsets January 2, 2024.

Bill #: HB 4018 Title: State Finance RC

Subject: Finance & Tax
Position: Staff: HW

Status: Referred to Rules.

Directs Oregon Department of Administrative Services to submit report on state budgetary procedures to Joint Interim Committee on Ways and Means. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 4019 Title: Revenue Reform

Subject: Finance & Tax
Position: Staff: HW

Status: Referred to Revenue.

Directs Legislative Revenue Officer to report to Legislative Assembly on options for revenue reform and make recommendations for legislation intended to reform current tax system. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 4020 Title: Elections RC

Subject: Elections
Position: Staff: HW

Status: Referred to Rules.

Requires Secretary of State to conduct study and develop recommendations regarding most effective methods for improving candidate inclusion in voters' pamphlet and efficacy of voters' pamphlet. Requires secretary to submit report detailing recommendations to interim legislative committees on rules by September 15, 2021. Sunsets January 2, 2022.

Bill #: HB 4021 Title: Imitation Voter Pamphlet

Subject: Elections
Position: Staff: HW

Status: Public Hearing scheduled.

Prohibits printing or circulating of imitation voters' pamphlet and circulating of imitation census questionnaire and other imitation official public body documents unless clearly marked as not official. Applies to documents printed or circulated on or after effective date of Act. Establishes civil penalty of up to \$10,000 for each violation. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 4023 Title: Forrest Water Quality

Subject: Water
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Rules.

Requires State Board of Forestry to obtain concurrence of Environmental Quality Commission before adopting rules related to commission water quality standards. Changes standard for board adoption of certain rules establishing new or increased standards for forest practices.

Bill #: HB 4024 Title: Hydrofluorocarbons

Subject: General Gov
Position: Staff: ML

Status: At Desk upon adjournment.

Prohibits certain products that use or contain hydrofluorocarbons from entering into commerce in Oregon if product was manufactured after specified date. Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to [amend, by rule, state building code to align requirements for use of certain equipment or products with Environmental Quality Commission prohibitions and requirements for use of hydrofluorocarbons or substitutes in such equipment or products.] adopt rules as necessary to align state building code with provisions of Act or rules adopted by Environmental Quality Commission pursuant to Act. Permits state contracting agencies to give preference to products that do not use or contain hydrofluorocarbons or that use or contain hydrofluorocarbons with low global warming potential. [Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.] Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 4025 Title: Forrest Water Quality

Subject: Water
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Rules.

Imposes prohibitions, restrictions and requirements regarding clearcutting and other forest operations near forest waters. Reduces share of revenue from timber harvest privilege tax appropriated to Oregon Forest Resources Institute Fund. Appropriates share of revenue from timber harvest privilege tax to State Forestry Department for administration and enforcement regarding clearcutting and other forest operations near forest waters and for infrastructure or other projects to protect forest waters. Refers Act to people for their approval or rejection at next regular general election.

Status: At Desk upon adjournment.

Reduces number of electors who must be registered as member of minor political party in order for minor political party to retain political party status from one-half of one percent to [one-third] one-quarter of one percent of total number of registered electors in state.

Bill #: HB 4032 Title: State Finance RC

Subject: Finance & Tax
Position: Staff: HW

Status: Referred to Ways and Means by prior reference.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Health Authority for expenses related to hospital nurse staffing program. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 4036 Title: Transportation Omnibus

Subject: Transportation
Position: Staff: ML

Status: At Desk upon adjournment.

Modifies, adds and repeals laws relating to transportation. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 4037 Title: Speed Bump Relating Clause

Subject: Transportation
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Public Hearing held.

Requires Department of Transportation to study development of uniform standards for speed bump height and markings. Sunsets January 2, 2024.

Bill #: HB 4038 Title: Speed Bump Relating Clause

Subject: Transportation
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Public Hearing held.

Requires Department of Transportation to study development of uniform standards for speed bump height and markings. Sunsets January 2, 2024.

Bill #: HB 4041 Title: OEM Standalone Agency Subject: Public Safety
 Position: Staff: HW
 Status: Referred to Ways and Means by prior reference.

[Renames Office of Emergency Management as Oregon Department of Emergency Management. Establishes department as state agency independent from Oregon Military Department. Vests in Oregon Department of Emergency Management emergency authority regarding public health emergencies, emergency quarantines and conflagrations. Transfers rulemaking authority regarding nuclear emergencies from State Department of Energy to Oregon Department of Emergency Management.] [Transfers Oregon Emergency Response System from Department of State Police to Oregon Department of Emergency Management.] [Renames office of State Fire Marshal as Department of the State Fire Marshal and establishes department as state agency independent from Department of State Police. Transfers search and rescue functions from Office of Emergency Management to Department of the State Fire Marshal.] [Transfers Oregon Homeland Security Council from Office of Emergency Management to Office of the Governor. Adds seven members to council and expands duties of council.] Provides that Director of Office of Emergency Management is appointed by Governor and subject to confirmation by Senate. Transfers oversight of certain aspects of director's duties from Adjutant General to Governor. Establishes Emergency Preparedness Advisory Council to advise and make policy recommendations to [Oregon Homeland Security Council] State Resilience Officer regarding resiliency at state, regional, local and tribal levels, in alignment with federal emergency support functions. Establishes Local Government Emergency Management Advisory Council to provide advice and recommendations to [Oregon Department] Office of Emergency Management regarding [the department's] office's emergency preparedness and response functions. Establishes Emergency Management Restructuring Task Force to study available emergency management resources and capabilities, to prepare recommendations for restructuring of emergency management systems and to study and prepare recommendations regarding mandatory leaves of absence for emergency volunteers. Sunsets task force June 30, 2022. [Becomes operative on July 1, 2023.] Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 4042 Title: Preference in Contracting Subject: Public Contracting
 Position: Staff: ML
 Status: Work Session scheduled.

Directs contracting agencies to give preference to bidder or proposer who is certified by Office of Emergency Management as emergency preparedness partner. Directs office to establish program for certification of business organizations as emergency preparedness partners. Provides that organizations shall be certified if minimum number of individuals in organization complete required training and meet other requirements.

Bill #: HB 4043 Title: Plastic Pipe Subject: Public Contracting
 Position: Staff: ML
 Status: Work Session scheduled.

Prohibits local government, local contracting agency or local contract review board from enacting, adopting or enforcing ordinance, resolution, rule or other law that prohibits, restricts or limits evaluation, comparison or use of pipe or piping materials for water project if pipe or piping materials meet current standards or performance specifications of specified organizations and moneys appropriated from State Treasury directly or indirectly provided funding for water project. Becomes operative on January 1, 2021. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 4045 Title: Prevailing Wages in E-zones Subject: Eco Devo
 Position: Staff: ML
 Status: Referred to Business and Labor.

Includes within definition of "public works" project for constructing, reconstructing or performing major renovation of privately owned road, highway, building, structure or improvement that is located in certain economic development zones or for which qualified business firm received or will receive exemption from ad valorem property taxation and has total project cost estimated as equaling or exceeding \$25 million. Defines "funds of a public agency," for purposes of applying prevailing rate of wage to projects for public works, to include tax credits or tax abatements that contractor engaged in public works project receives from state in connection with project. Requires contractor or contractor's surety to file certified statements with public agency that awarded contract for public works or public agency that granted exemption from taxation. Provides that business firm or contractor that commences project for public works in nonurban county shall either pay prevailing wage or employ apprentices for specified portion of total work hours that workers in apprenticeable occupations perform on public works. Becomes operative 91 days after effective date of Act. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 4050 Title: Land Use Relating Clause Subject: Land Use
 Position: Staff: ML
 Status: Public Hearing and Work Session scheduled.

Directs Department of Land Conservation and Development to study laws related to use of land and to report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2020. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: [HB 4054](#) Title: Wild Fires

Subject: Public Safety
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Ways and Means by order of Speaker.

[Moves provision regarding giving notification of wildfire to forestland owner.] Creates Land Use and Wildfire Policy Advisory Committee. Sunsets advisory committee July 1, 2021. Requires State Forestry Department, Oregon State University and Department of Land Conservation and Development to conduct study of regional wildfire risk within state. Requires departments and advisory committee to report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than February 1, 2021, regarding possible means for implementing final recommendations produced by Governor's Council on Wildfire Response. Requires inclusion of regional wildfire risk information in report. Authorizes assignment of council to assist state and local agencies and officials regarding implementation of wildfire risk reduction programs. Requires council to report to Legislative Assembly no later than October 31, 2020, with detailed recommendations regarding sustainable financing model for funding comprehensive wildfire strategy. Requires State Department of Energy to commission study of feasibility of using materials from wildfire fuel reduction projects for renewable energy generation. Requires appointment of advisory committee to assist with study. Requires study to be completed by January 15, 2021. Appropriates moneys to Department of Land Conservation and Development, State Forestry Department, Oregon State University and State Department of Energy for 2019-2021 biennium to carry out Act. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: [HB 4057](#) Title: PERS EIF Funding Gambling

Subject: PERS
Position: Staff: HW

Status: Work Session held.

Prohibits Oregon State Lottery from offering games based on outcomes of sporting events organized by, sponsored by or played in connection with post-secondary institutions of education.

Bill #: [HB 4060](#) Title: Emergency Transports

Subject: Public Safety
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Health Care with subsequent referral to Ways and Means.

Requires Oregon Health Authority, upon receipt of federal approval, to assess fee on emergency medical services providers and use fee to reimburse costs of emergency medical services transports. Authorizes Medicaid supplemental reimbursements to be paid in addition to reimbursements paid by coordinated care organizations for emergency medical services transports. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: [HB 4062](#) Title: Portland Heart Lung

Subject: Workers Comp
Position: Staff: HW

Status: At Desk upon adjournment.

Requires city that provides disability or retirement system for firefighters and police officers by ordinance or charter that is not subject to workers' compensation law to apply provisions requiring presumption that condition or impairment of health is occupational disease that results from employment if firefighter took physical examination upon gaining or during employment that failed to reveal evidence of occupational disease that existed before employment. Requires that city's denial of claim for compensation for occupational disease must be on basis of clear and convincing medical evidence that condition or impairment of health is unrelated to employment. Establishes that time limitations for filing claim are one year from date claimant first discovered or should have discovered occupational disease, one year from date claimant becomes disabled or is informed by physician that claimant is suffering from occupational disease or one year from date that worker's beneficiary first discovered or reasonably should have discovered that cause of worker's death was occupational disease.

Bill #: [HB 4066](#) Title: PUC EV Charging

Subject: General Gov
Position: Staff: ML

Status: At Desk upon adjournment.

Authorizes Public Utility Commission to allow electric companies to recover costs from retail electricity consumers for prudent [investments or expenses in] infrastructure measures [that support adoption of electric vehicles] to support transportation electrification if certain criteria are met. Requires electric company participating in clean fuels program to use revenues from sale of certain credits for programs to accelerate transportation electrification. Requires consumer-owned utility to register as credit aggregator and credit generator under clean fuels program and use revenues

from sale of credits for programs to support acceleration of transportation electrification. Repeals requirements on January 2, 2026. Requires electric company to have and operate in compliance with risk-based wildfire protection plan approved by commission. Requires submission of first plan no later than December 31, 2020. Requires consumer-owned utility to have and operate in compliance with risk-based wildfire mitigation plan approved by governing body of utility. Requires submission of first plan no later than December 31, 2021. Requires commission to periodically convene workshops to develop and share information for best practices regarding wildfires. Provides that terms and conditions of requirements for risk-based wildfire plans do not affect terms or conditions of easements held by electric utility over private land as of effective date of Act. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 4068 Title: Electrical Vehicles Subject: General Gov
Position: Staff: ML

Status: At Desk upon adjournment.

Requires Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to amend state building code to [create electric vehicle charging infrastructure requirements for] require that new construction of certain buildings include provisions for electrical service capacity for specified percentage of parking spaces. Allows municipality to adopt local [electric vehicle charging infrastructure requirements exceeding] percentage of parking space requirements higher than state building code requirements. [Establishes goal of having 25 percent of vehicles owned or leased by state be zero-emission vehicles.] Requires director to make code amendments effective July 1, 2021.

Bill #: HB 4069 Title: Water Use Measurement Subject: Water
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Public Hearing held.

Authorizes Water Resources Department to require reporting of water use measurements.

Bill #: HB 4070 Title: Sewer Loan Money Subject: Wastewater
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Ways and Means by prior reference.

Appropriates moneys to Department of Environmental Quality to award grant for on-site septic system low-interest loan programs and to cover related administrative costs. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 4071 Title: HABs Subject: Water
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Ways and Means by prior reference.

Directs Department of Environmental Quality to purchase cyanotoxin autoanalyzer system and associated supplies and services. Directs department to create, fill and utilize seasonal position to assist with cyanotoxin analysis. Directs department to make system available to institutions of higher education, subject to certain conditions. Requires department to report to Legislative Assembly, on or before November 30, 2020, on preparations to coordinate use of system and on actions that may be taken to coordinate state government agency responses to harmful algal blooms. Directs Oregon Health Authority to create, fill and utilize small utility outreach coordinator. Appropriates moneys to department to purchase equipment and support increased staffing level. Appropriates moneys to authority to support increased staffing level. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 4076 Title: Age Discrimination Task Force Subject: Labor
Position: Staff: ML

Status: At Desk upon adjournment.

Establishes Task Force on Age Discrimination. Directs task force to identify and evaluate impacts of age discrimination in workplace and report to interim committees relating to business and labor. Sunsets December 31, 2021. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 4077 Title: Renter's Well Water Subject: Water
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Work Session scheduled.

Requires seller of real property to test well water used for domestic purposes. Requires laboratory to submit results of test to seller, buyer and Department of Environmental Quality, in form and manner prescribed by department. Requires

department to provide results of well water tests to Oregon Health Authority. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: [HB 4079](#) **Title:** Universal Charge for Broadband **Subject:** Public Safety
Position: **Staff:** HW
Status: At Desk upon adjournment.

Modifies definitions applicable for purposes of universal service surcharge. Subjects sale of retail commercial mobile radio services and retail interconnected voice over internet protocol services to universal service surcharge. Reduces rate cap to six percent of sale of services subject to surcharge. Directs Public Utility Commission to transfer up to \$5 million per year of moneys deposited in universal service fund to Broadband Fund. Establishes Broadband Fund. Continuously appropriates moneys in Broadband Fund to Oregon Business Development Department to provide grants and loans through, and to administer, program related to broadband. Directs department to adopt program for providing grants and loans by rule. Directs department to report annually to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to telecommunications on status of Broadband Fund. Sunsets Broadband Fund, transfer of moneys from universal service fund to Broadband Fund and grant program on January 2, 2030. Becomes operative on January 1, 2021. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: [HB 4084](#) **Title:** Rural SDCs **Subject:** General Gov
Position: **Staff:** ML
Status: Referred to Ways and Means by prior reference.

Establishes Rural System Development Charges Program within Housing and Community Services Department to pay system development charges for rural affordable multifamily housing. Establishes Rural System Development Charges Fund. Appropriates moneys from General Fund to department for purposes of program. Sunsets June 30, 2027. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: [HB 4086](#) **Title:** Final Order Stays **Subject:** Water
Position: **Staff:** ML
Status: Public Hearing held.

Makes routine staying of Water Resources Commission or Water Resources Department final order upon filing of petition for judicial review inapplicable if order enforces terms and conditions of use of water or priority of use of water. Establishes conditions for court stay of commission or department order that enforces terms and conditions of use of water or priority of use of water. Provides that if petitioner files undertaking, and court rules against petitioner or petitioner voluntarily withdraws petition regarding order enforcing terms and conditions of use of water or priority of use of water, court may award commission or department attorney fees and costs out of undertaking. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: [HB 4087](#) **Title:** BOLI Technical Assistance **Subject:** Labor
Position: **Staff:** HW
Status: At Desk upon adjournment.

[Directs portion of remainder of sums collected from employers as civil penalties for violations of certain employment laws to be credited to Bureau of Labor and Industries Account to provide technical assistance to employers and portion of remainder of sums collected to be credited to Wage Security Fund. Caps total amounts credited to Bureau of Labor and Industries Account and to Wage Security Fund at \$290,000 per year. Directs any amount remaining that exceeds cap to be paid to Department of State Lands for benefit of Common School Fund.] Allows payment from Wage Security Fund to be made to wage claimant for wages earned and unpaid in event that Commissioner of Bureau of Labor and Industries has obtained judgment in action or has issued final order in administrative proceeding for collection of wage claim. [Directs bureau to submit to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to business and labor, by September 15, 2022, report that describes how moneys credited to Bureau of Labor and Industries Account were spent on providing technical assistance to employers. Sunsets provisions on January 1, 2023.]

Bill #: [HB 4090](#) **Title:** Affordable Housing **Subject:** Land Use
Position: **Staff:** ML
Status: At Desk upon adjournment.

Authorizes Land Conservation and Development Commission to approve plans for urban growth boundary expansion to accommodate affordable housing in Pendleton. Sunsets affordable housing pilot program on January 2, 2026. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 4092 Title: Historic Reservoir Subject: Water
 Position: Staff: ML
 Status: At Desk upon adjournment.

Allows owner of reservoir located on specified property within Big Butte Creek drainage area to register reservoir with Water Resources Department. Establishes application and qualification deadlines. Exempts registered reservoir from water right permit and water right certificate requirements. Prohibits diversion or other uses, except for suppressing or extinguishing fire, of reservoir water. Makes reservoir use subservient to water rights. Requires property owner to measure and report flows into and out of reservoir. Requires department to order removal of reservoir if not registered. Requires department to cancel registration and order removal of reservoir if reservoir ceases to meet requirements.

Bill #: HB 4094 Title: Mandatory Bargaining Subjects Subject: Labor
 Position: Staff: HW
 Status: Referred to Education.

Amends definition of "employment relations" to include class size and caseload limits as mandatory collective bargaining subjects for school districts.

Bill #: HB 4095 Title: UGB Expansion Subject: Land Use
 Position: Staff: ML
 Status: At Desk upon adjournment.

[Authorizes Department of Land Conservation and Development to approve local governments' plans for urban growth boundary expansion areas that will accommodate affordable housing.] Extends Department of Land Conservation and Development reporting requirements on affordable housing pilot program through 2024. Limits period when political contributions may be used for these purposes to when candidate or holder of public office is campaigning for public office.

Prohibits state agencies from authorizing construction of new infrastructure for exploration, development or production of oil or gas on state-owned real property or for transportation of oil or gas across state-owned real property. Requires facilities unloading oil or gas received by rail to provide advance notice to Department of Transportation. Prohibits facilities from loading or unloading oil or gas with vapor pressure of nine pounds per square inch or more. Delays operative date based on annual volume of oil and gas transported by rail. Imposes maximum penalty of \$2,500 per day per railcar for facility violations. Directs department to transmit information received from facilities to office of State Fire Marshal. Requires State Fire Marshal to consider information in developing oil and hazardous materials spill response plan.

Makes unlawful practice for place of public accommodation to refuse to accept United States coins or currency as payment for goods and services. Creates limited exceptions. Allows person to file complaint with Commissioner of Bureau of Labor and Industries alleging unlawful practice against operator or person acting on behalf of place of public accommodation. Becomes operative on July 1, 2021. [Allows person to bring civil action alleging unlawful practice against operator or person acting on behalf of place of public accommodation. Becomes operative on January 1, 2022.] Limits authority of school district to become member of voluntary organization that administers interscholastic activities unless organization implements policy that prohibits discrimination based on race, color or national origin. Clarifies meaning of race to include natural hair, hair texture, hair type and protective hairstyles for purposes of prohibited discrimination under antidiscrimination statutes. Clarifies that valid dress code or policy may not have disproportionate adverse impact on members of protected class.

Prohibits aerial pesticide applicator from spraying or otherwise applying by aircraft pesticide product containing chlorpyrifos. Prohibits person from applying pesticide product containing chlorpyrifos within 300 feet of campus of school. Requires person that employs worker to take steps to ensure that worker does not enter into area in which pesticide product containing chlorpyrifos was applied within eight preceding calendar days. Effective January 1, 2022, prohibits sale, purchase or use of pesticide product containing chlorpyrifos. Requires State Department of Agriculture to revoke, on January 1, 2022, pesticide registrations for pesticide products containing chlorpyrifos. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Establishes requirements for agreement. Provides that organization may use revenues from program only to reimburse administrative costs and expenses, to reimburse county sheriffs' offices for certain costs relating to search and rescue and to issue grants for search and rescue purposes. [Declares emergency, effective on passage.] Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Authorizes Bureau of Labor and Industries to conduct inquiries and investigations, including criminal records checks, to determine whether employer and any employees of employer have adequate character and fitness to employ minors in compliance with provisions relating to employment of minors. Requires Commissioner of Bureau of Labor and Industries to adopt rules no later than January 1, 2021. Requires submission of attestation form before bureau may issue annual employment certification to employer. Authorizes commissioner to deny, revoke or refuse to issue employment certification and impose civil penalty if employer falsifies or misrepresents information in attestation form or permits employee who is required to report as sex offender to have direct contact with minor who is employed by employer. Allows minor who is employed by employer and who claims to be aggrieved by employer's failure to comply with requirements to file civil action. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Imposes tsunami design standards for certain buildings and other structures. Directs Secretary of State to adopt rules to implement Ballot Measure 47 (2006) and to issue proposed rules no later than December 31, 2020. Provides original jurisdiction to Supreme Court for judicial review of Ballot Measure 47 (2006). Repeals operative date, rules and original jurisdiction provisions if Supreme Court issues court decision in Multnomah County v. Elizabeth Trojan that does not render Ballot Measure 47 (2006) operative under section 9 (f), chapter 3, Oregon laws 2007 (Ballot Measure 47 (2006)). Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Authorizes Public Utilities Commission to allow rate or rate schedule to include differential rates or to reflect amounts for programs that enable public utilities to assist low-income residential customers. Authorizes commission to allow rate or rate schedule to reflect amounts for investments in infrastructure measures that support adoption of alternative forms of transportation vehicles. Amends greenhouse gas reporting statute. Requires Environmental Quality Commission to adopt by rule standards and requirements for reducing methane gas emissions from landfills. Abolishes Oregon Global Warming Commission and transfers duties to Oregon Climate Board. Provides for direct expedited review by Oregon Supreme Court of certain constitutional question related to Oregon Climate Action Program. Requires and modifies certain reports and proposals. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Requires Governor to facilitate mediation sessions between representatives of forest industry and representatives of environmental interests. Allows person to register with State Forestry Department to receive notice of pesticide applications by helicopter to forestland near person's residence or water intake used by person. Requires notice to department of proposed or imminent pesticide application by helicopter to forestland. Requires department to give notice of application to persons registered to receive notice. Requires notice to department upon completion or partial completion of pesticide application. Provides escalating penalties for failures to report. Caps penalties at \$5,000 per day. Requires Pesticide Analytical and Response Center to accept requests from certain entities for records and data concerning pesticide application by helicopter to forestland. Imposes fine of \$1,000 for failure of pesticide operator to timely supply records or data. Prohibits impeding pesticide application by helicopter to forestland. Makes violation subject to fine of \$1,000 for first offense or \$5,000 for repeat offense within five years. Prohibits pesticide application by helicopter to forestland in proximity to certain locations. Requires State Board of Forestry to make certain rules applicable in Siskiyou Georegion. Requires development and maintenance of comprehensive inventory of points of diversion for water on forestland. Appropriates moneys to Office of Governor for biennium ending June 30, 2021, for purpose of paying expenses related to mediation sessions. Appropriates moneys to State Forestry Department for biennium ending June 30, 2021, for carrying out department duties, functions and powers under Act with regard to private forests. Limits expenditures for biennium ending June 30, 2021, by State Forestry Department from moneys including federal funds from United States Forest Service for fire protection and research projects, but excluding federal funds not previously authorized for expenditure and lottery funds, for carrying out department duties, functions and powers under Act with regard to private forests. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Requires Department of Transportation, in consultation with Department of Environmental Quality and other appropriate state agencies, to study modifying classification of diesel fuel. Requires Department of Transportation to report results of study to Joint Committee on Transportation during 2021 regular session of Legislative Assembly. Requires report to include implementation plan for reclassifying diesel fuel.

Requires department to submit, no later than September 15, 2031, report to interim committees related to environment and natural resources of Legislative Assembly on [environmental and economic impacts of program] assessments of conditions of qualifying streams affected by authorized voluntary projects and make recommendations for legislation. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: SB 1513 Title: Confined Animal Feeding Operations

Requires Department of Environmental Quality or State Department of Agriculture approval as prerequisite to construction or installation of qualifying operation. Limits fees for approvals. Requires that permit for qualifying operation located in ground water management area and applying animal waste to land be issued as individual permit. Authorizes Department of Environmental Quality and State Department of Agriculture to clean, repurpose or decommission vacated, abandoned or unpermitted qualifying operation. Specifies that permit requirement for activities increasing effluent in manner not already

lawfully authorized applies to concentrated animal feeding operations. Appropriates moneys to State Department of Agriculture for biennium ending June 30, 2021, for purpose of adopting rules to carry out regulation of operations. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

[Authorizes commission to allow electric companies and natural gas utilities to recover costs for prudent investments in or expenses for infrastructure measures that support adoption and service of alternative forms of transportation.] Amends greenhouse gas reporting statute. Repeals Energy Facility Siting Council carbon dioxide emissions standards. Requires review and revision of assessment as required by governing body of utility. Requires State Forestry Department to develop and maintain statewide map of wildfire risk. Allows local government to adopt local defensible space requirements in excess of State Fire Marshal requirements.] [Authorizes State Fire Marshal to contract for local government enforcement of minimum defensible space requirements. Requires contracting local government to periodically report to State Fire Marshal regarding compliance with defensible space requirements. Requires State Fire Marshal to maintain map of defensible space requirements and compliance.] [Requires State Fire Marshal to administer and enforce program to provide assistance to local governments for administration and enforcement of defensible space requirements. Establishes Wildfire Defensible Space Fund. Establishes Forestland and Rangeland Treatment Fund.] [Requires State Forester to establish baseline levels of wildfire protection for lands susceptible to wildfire.] [Authorizes county, State Forester and State Fire Marshal to assist landowners and jurisdictions to form, expand or change boundaries of jurisdiction that provides wildfire protection and assist jurisdiction in developing adequate wildfire protection facilities, equipment, training and other resources. Requires that county ensure lands susceptible to wildfire are provided with wildfire protection meeting or exceeding baseline level no later than January 1, 2025.] [Requires State Forestry Department to contract for services of private consultant to evaluate and make recommendations on specified issues regarding wildfires. Requires consultant to report to Governor and legislative committee no later than September 15, 2022.] [Allows Governor to authorize joint state-federal partnerships to direct wildfire strategy based on NOTE: Matter in boldfaced type in an amended section is new; matter [italic and bracketed] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in boldfaced type. LC 83 B-Eng. SB 1536 recommendations of Governor's Council on Wildfire Response. Authorizes council duties. Requires 1 council to report recommendations for

stable funding to implement council wildfire strategy no later than October 31, 2020.] Creates Land Use and Wildfire Policy Advisory Committee. 3 Requires State Forestry Department and Oregon State University, in consultation with Department of Land Conservation and Development, to conduct study of regional wildfire risk within state. 5 Requires State Forestry Department, in collaboration with Department of Land Conservation and Development and advisory committee, to report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than February 1, 2021, regarding possible means for implementing final recommendations produced by Governor's Council on Wildfire Response. Directs State Resilience Officer and Seismic Safety Policy Advisory Commission to update Oregon Resilience Plan. Directs commission to initiate public process to update boundaries of tsunami inundation zone. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: SB 1538 Title: Guns in Public Buildings

Authorizes city, county, metropolitan service district, school district, college or university to adopt ordinance or policy limiting or precluding affirmative defense for possession of firearms in public buildings by concealed handgun licensees. Modifies definition of "public building" for purposes of crime of unlawful possession of weapon in public building. Punishes violation by maximum of five years' imprisonment, \$125,000 fine, or both.

Bill #: SB 1541 Title: Senior Frozen Property Tax

Provides, for purposes of ad valorem property taxation, frozen assessed value for homestead of individual at least 68 years old, or person with disability, if homestead and individual would be eligible for homestead property tax deferral program but for fact that homestead is pledged as security for reverse mortgage. Provides that frozen assessed value equals assessed value of homestead for property tax year immediately preceding first property tax year to which valid claim relates. [Provides for unfreezing of assessed value if new property or new improvements are added to tax account of homestead.] Provides that, after occurrence of certain circumstances, [assessed value shall be what it would have been if homestead had never been granted frozen assessed value] homestead shall be assessed and taxed as other property similarly situated is assessed and taxed. Sunsets program after six years. Grandfathers homesteads granted frozen assessed value before sunset. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

recommendation of scientifically based rationale for removing designation in specific areas of Lower Umatilla Basin Groundwater Management Area if practicable. Requires that program include appointment of, and support for, task force. Sunsets program January 2, 2030. Appropriates moneys to State Department of Agriculture for biennium ending June 30, 2021, to carry out program activities. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: SB 1567 Title: Arbitration Awards RC Subject: Labor Position: Staff: HW
 Status: At Desk upon adjournment.

Restricts arbitration award from ordering disciplinary action that differs from disciplinary action imposed by law enforcement agency if arbitrator makes finding that misconduct occurred consistent with agency's finding of misconduct, and disciplinary action imposed by agency is consistent with provisions of discipline guide or discipline matrix adopted by agency as result of collective bargaining and incorporated into agency's disciplinary policies. Specifies that for purposes of collective bargaining involving sworn [employees] law enforcement officers of law enforcement agency, "employment relations" includes development of discipline guide or discipline matrix. Refers proposed amendment to people for their approval or rejection at next regular general election.
