

Bill #: HB 2003 Title: Campaign Finance Limits Subject: Campaign Finance Position: Staff: HW

Status: Referred to Rules.

Establishes limits on campaign contributions that may be accepted by candidates and political committees.

Requires political committee to identify as caucus, measure, multicandidate, political party, recall or small donor political

committee. Prohibits person from controlling more than one of each committee.

Authorizes Secretary of State and Attorney General to require return of contribution excess of limits and impose civil penalty up to 100 percent of total amount of contribution.

Repeals Ballot Measure 47 (2006), currently held in abeyance, which establishes limits on political campaign contributions and independent expenditures on candidate races and establishes certain campaign finance disclosure requirements.

Establishes Small Donor Elections Program to enable candidates for office of state Representative and state Senator to receive 6-to-1 match on small dollar donations. Limits matching funds.

Allows resident taxpayers to designate contribution to Small Donor Elections Fund on income tax return form.

Directs most election law penalties to Small Donor Elections Fund.

Becomes operative on November 4, 2026.

Refers Act to people for their approval or rejection at next regular general election..

Bill #: HB 2004 Title: Ranked Choice Voting Subject: Elections

Status: Public Hearing scheduled.

Establishes ranked choice voting as voting method for selecting winner of nomination for and election to offices of President of United States, United States Senator, Representative in Congress, Governor, Secretary of State, State Treasurer and Attorney General.

Authorizes cities, counties, metropolitan service districts and local government and local service districts to elect to use ranked choice voting to nominate or elect candidates for relevant offices.

Moves election for Commissioner of Bureau of Labor and Industries to general election, where election is conducted using ranked choice voting.

Bill #: HB 2007 Title: Firearms in Public Areas Subject: Guns

Status: Work Session scheduled.

Authorizes governing bodies of certain public entities that own or control public building to adopt policy, ordinance or regulation or precluding affirmative defense for possession of firearms in public building and adjacent grounds by concealed handgun licensees. Provides that in prosecution for possession of firearm in building or on grounds subject to such policy, ordinance or regulation, concealed handgun licensee affirmative defense is not complete defense, but results in Class A misdemeanor conviction punishable by 364 days' imprisonment, \$6,250 fine, or both.

Increases penalties for assault committed against parks and recreation employees. Punishes by maximum of five years' imprisonment, \$125,000 fine, or both.

Status: Referred to Economic Development and Small Business with subsequent referral to Housing and Homelessness.

Requires Housing and Community Services Department to study housing. Directs department to submit findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to housing no later than September 15, 2024.



Bill #: HB 2028 Title: RC Subject: General Government

Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Economic Development and Small Business with subsequent referral to Housing and Homelessness.

Requires Housing and Community Services Department to study permitting. Directs department to submit findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to economic development no later than September 15, 2024.

Bill #: HB 2034 Title: Legislative Conflicts of Interest Subject: General Government

Position: Staff: HW

Status: Referred to Rules.

Prohibits members of Legislative Assembly from participating in discussion or debate if actual conflict of interest exists. Prohibits members from voting on issue when actual conflict of interest exists unless vote is necessary to establish quorum.

Bill #: HB 2035 Title: Ethics Study Subject: Ethics

Status: Referred to Rules.

Requires Oregon Government Ethics Commission to study how to improve efficacy of Oregon's government ethics laws. Directs commission to submit findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to government ethics not later than September 15, 2024.

Bill #: HB 2036 Title: RC Subject: Public Meetings Position: Staff: ML

Status: Referred to Rules.

Requires Oregon Government Ethics Commission to study public meetings law and practices in Oregon. Directs commission to submit findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to rules not later than September 15, 2024.

Subject: Public Records Bill #: HB 2037 Title: RC

Status: Referred to Rules.

Requires Public Records Advisory Council to study public records law and practices. Directs council to submit findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to rules not later than September 15, 2024.

Bill #: HB 2038 Title: Statements of Economic Interest Subject: Ethics

Status: Referred to Rules.

Requires statement of economic interest to include certain information about sources of income for business in which public official or candidate, or member of household of public official or candidate, is officer, holds directorship or does business under if source of income has legislative or administrative interest and 10 percent or more of total gross annual income of business comes from that source of income.

Prohibits candidate or principal campaign committee of candidate from expending campaign moneys for professional services rendered by certain businesses required to be listed on candidate's statement of economic interest. Creates exceptions.

Requires Bureau of Labor and Industries to study employment issues related to state's wage and hour laws. Directs bureau to submit findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to business and labor not later than September 15, 2024. Sunsets January 2, 2025.

Transfers Oregon Cybersecurity Advisory Council from office of Enterprise Information Services to Oregon Cybersecurity Center

Transfers Oregon Cybersecurity Advisory Council from office of Enterprise Information Services to Oregon Cybersecurity Center of Excellence. Modifies composition and duties, powers and functions of council.

Establishes Oregon Cybersecurity Center of Excellence within Portland State University to supplement activities of State Chief Information Officer regarding cybersecurity. Charges center with coordinating, funding or providing cybersecurity education, awareness and training for public, private and nonprofit sectors, cybersecurity workforce development and cybersecurity-related goods and services to Oregon public bodies. Directs Portland State University, Oregon State University and University of Oregon to jointly operate center by agreement and to provide administrative and staff support and facilities for center.

Establishes Oregon Cybersecurity Center of Excellence Operating Fund. Continuously appropriates moneys in fund to Higher Education Coordinating Commission for distribution to center to carry out functions and operations of center.

Establishes Oregon Cybersecurity Workforce Development Fund. Continuously appropriates moneys in fund to commission for distribution to center to invest in cybersecurity workforce development programs.

Establishes Oregon Cybersecurity Grant Program Fund. Continuously appropriates moneys in fund to commission for

Establishes Oregon Cybersecurity Frogram Fund. Continuously appropriates moneys in fund to commission for distribution to center to provide cybersecurity-related goods and services to Oregon public bodies.

Establishes Oregon Cybersecurity Public Awareness Fund. Continuously appropriates moneys in fund to commission for

distribution to center to raise public awareness regarding cybersecurity threats and resources to be safer and more secure online.

Becomes operative October 1, 2023.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Makes contractor liable for unpaid wages, including other benefit payment or contributions of employee of subcontractor at any

Permits third party owed payment or contribution made as part of employee compensation to bring action against contractor on behalf of employee for unpaid wages.

Requires subcontractor to provide certain payroll records and other information to contractor upon request. Permits contractor to withhold payment to subcontractor for failure to comply with request for records.

Requires annual tax statement to include notice in cases of increase of more than three percent of property's assessed value and reason for increase] information about contacting county assessor if property's assessed value increased more than three percent over prior tax year.

Makes correction of certain errors on assessment and tax roll mandatory.

Title: Ag Land Jurisdiction Bill #: HB 2121 Subject: Environment

Makes Legislative Counsel, rather than Attorney General, responsible for drafting ballot titles for state measures.

Removes requirement that signature gatherer certify each signature sheet.

Removes registration and training requirements for paid signature gatherers. Removes estimate of financial impact requirements for state measures.

Eliminates Citizens' Initiative Review Commission.

Restricts public body from imposing fee for public record if public body maintains record in electronic form, requester agrees to accept record in electronic form and record is retrievable by public body without need to conduct archival search for record.
