

Bill #: HB 2005 Title: Housing RCSubject: General Government
Position: Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Directs Housing and Community Services Department to study issues relating to housing supply and report to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly on or before September 15, 2022.

Sunsets December 31, 2022.

Bill #: HB 2008 Title: Religious Affordable HousingSubject: Finance & Tax
Position: Staff: HW

Status: Chapter 446, (2021 Laws): Effective date September 25, 2021.

Provides tax exemption for property of religious organization held or used solely to provide affordable housing to low income households. Conditions tax exemption on property being subject to covenant to maintain affordability for not less than 60 years. Provides that default six-year sunset of tax expenditures does not apply to exemption. Requires initial claim to be filed with Department of Revenue and annual claims with county assessor thereafter.

Restricts conditions that local governments may place on development of affordable housing provided by religious nonprofit corporations and expands zoning where such housing must be allowed.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 2009 Title: Strategies to Protect Covid RCSubject: Workers Comp
Position: Staff: HW

Status: Chapter 106, (2021 Laws): Effective date June 1, 2021.

Establishes temporary limitations on lenders' remedies for borrowers' failures to make payments on obligations secured by mortgages, trust deeds or land sale contracts for certain real property.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 2012 Title: Telecommunicator First RespondersSubject: Public Safety
Position: Staff: HW

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Provides that Legislative Assembly finds and declares that telecommunicators are first responders.

Provides that telecommunicator qualifies as police officer under Public Employees Retirement System. Provides that telecommunicator employed on effective date of Act is entitled to service in retirement system as police officer for all service performed as telecommunicator.

Bill #: HB 2018 Title: Ground Water BudgetsSubject: Water
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Chapter 608, (2021 Laws): Effective date January 1, 2022.

Instructs Water Resources Department to enter into agreement with United States Geological Survey to produce and publish ground water budgets for all major hydrologic basins in this state, contract for person to produce report on statewide consumptive water use, expand ground water level monitoring network, measure progress in estimating and monitoring ground water levels, recharge and use and ensure that department staff members serve as community engagement coordinators.

Increases appropriation to department from General Fund for technical services.

Bill #: HB 2020 Title: Emergency DeclarationsSubject: General Government
Position: Staff: HW

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Establishes durational limits for states of emergency declared under certain statutes. Provides that Legislative Assembly may extend states of emergency by joint resolution.

Bill #: [HB 2021](#) Title: Clean EnergySubject: Environment
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Chapter 508, (2021 Laws): Effective date September 25, 2021.

Requires retail electricity providers to reduce greenhouse gas emissions associated with electricity sold to Oregon consumers to 80 percent below baseline emissions levels by 2030, 90 percent below baseline emissions levels by 2035 and 100 percent below baseline emissions levels by 2040. Requires electric companies to develop clean energy plans and electricity service suppliers to report information for meeting clean energy targets.

Directs Department of Environment Quality to determine amount of emissions reduction necessary for each retail electricity provider to meet clean energy targets. Limits cumulative rate impact for compliance to six percent of annual revenue requirements. Permits performance incentive for early compliance.

Requires electric company that files clean energy plan to convene Community Benefits and Impacts Advisory Group with input from stakeholders who represent interests of customers and affected entities and communities. Requires electric company to file biennial report with Public Utility Commission that assesses community benefits and impacts of electric company.

Directs State Department of Energy to convene work group to examine opportunities to encourage development of small scale and community-based renewable energy projects and report findings to interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than September 30, 2022. Sunsets December 15, 2022.

Permits electric company, if agreed to and in coordination with government, to provide program of rates or charges to serve retail electricity consumers that covers costs of electricity generated from renewable energy resources or nonemitting energy resources or paired with unbundled renewable energy certificates. Defines "government."

Requires electricity service suppliers to publicly disclose aggregated energy supply mix and associated emissions of power sources.

Establishes contractor labor standards in construction or repowering of large-scale projects. Defines "large-scale project."

Prohibits Energy Facility Siting Council from issuing site certificate for new generating facility that produces energy from fossil fuels unless facility generates only nonemitting electricity. Prohibits council from approving amendment of site certificate for generating facility in manner that would increase carbon dioxide emissions from operation of generating facility.

Creates grant program within State Department of Energy to provide grants to Indian tribes, public bodies and consumer-owned utilities to plan or develop community renewable energy projects. Establishes Community Renewable Investment Fund within State Treasury for purposes of grant program for community renewable energy projects. Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Community Renewable Investment Fund.

Increases, from eight percent to 10 percent by 2030, requirement that aggregate electrical capacity of all electric companies be composed of electricity from small-scale renewable energy projects or facilities using biomass.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: [HB 2026](#) Title: EO Border PreferencesSubject: Labor
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Chapter 509, (2021 Laws): Effective date July 19, 2021.

Requires public employers to give preferences to residents of Eastern Oregon Border Economic Development Region] Malheur County for civil service positions if majority of work of position will be performed within Eastern Oregon Border Economic Development Region. Provides that resident applicant who receives position must maintain residency in Malheur County for at least five consecutive years following date on which employment begins. Provides that failure to maintain residency shall be considered voluntary termination of employment. Provides that resident applicant who elects not to receive preference is not subject to residency requirement. Authorizes Eastern Oregon Border Economic Development Board, in consultation with governing body of Malheur County, to prescribe method for employee to notify employer of county of residence.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: [HB 2029](#) Title: PRACSubject: Public Records
Position: Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Establishes Public Records Advocate as independent office within executive department. Authorizes Public Records Advisory Council to appoint advocate. Authorizes council to support or oppose legislation relating to public records law and to request legislators to introduce legislation relating to public records law. Ratifies and affirms actions taken by council before effective date of Act to recruit and appoint advocate.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: [HB 2031](#) Title: PesticidesSubject: Environment
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Chapter 177, (2021 Laws): Effective date January 1, 2022.

Modifies definition of "pesticide applicator." Adds violations of federal law to reasons for which State Department of Agriculture may revoke, suspend or refuse to issue pesticide license or certificate. Modifies authority of department to impose civil penalties for violation of provisions related to restricted-use pesticides.

Bill #: HB 2032 Title: Maintained Channels Subject: Water
 Position: Staff: ML

Status: Chapter 26, (2021 Laws): Effective date May 17, 2021.

Establishes that Department of State Lands or State Department of Agriculture rules implementing traditionally maintained channels program may provide for implementation on region-by-region basis. Requires implementation throughout state within five-year period.
 Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 2034 Title: Jet Fuel Tax 3/5ths Subject: Finance & Tax
 Position: Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Removes sunset of increase in aircraft fuel taxes made by House Bill 2075 (chapter 700, Oregon Laws 2015). Restructures distributions of aircraft fuel tax revenues that provides funding for airports and aviation-related business under Aviation System Action Program.
 Allows Oregon Department of Aviation to enter into commercial arrangements for terms up to 50 years.
 Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 2037 Title: Loan Limits Subject: Economic Development
 Position: Staff: ML

Status: Chapter 19, (2021 Laws): Effective date January 1, 2022.

Increases limits for loans for certain business development projects made with moneys from Oregon Business Development Fund and provides for annual adjustment of limits for changes in Consumer Price Index.

Bill #: HB 2039 Title: WCD Regulatory Streamlining Subject: Workers Comp
 Position: Staff: HW

Status: Chapter 21, (2021 Laws): Effective date January 1, 2022.

Provides that insurer and self-insured employer may keep records of workers' compensation claims at location outside this state if insurer or self-insured employer makes records available to Department of Consumer and Business Services at location inside this state.
 Provides that person that awards contract to another person is not responsible for providing workers' compensation insurance coverage for individuals who perform labor under contract if other person is licensed as construction contractor or landscape contracting business.

Bill #: HB 2040 Title: Electronic Claim Reporting Subject: Workers Comp
 Position: Staff: HW

Status: Chapter 47, (2021 Laws): effective on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Permits Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to specify by rule methods for reporting claims, denials of claims and closures of claims related to workers' compensation cases.
 Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 2050 Title: Water Quality Schools Subject: Water
 Position: Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Directs Department of Education to study water quality in schools. Requires report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to education.
 Sunsets January 2, 2022.
 Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 2061 Title: Fair Share Payment In Lieu Subject: Labor
 Position: Staff: HW

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Removes authority of public employer and labor organization to enter into fair-share agreement. Removes authority of public employer to deduct in-lieu-of-dues payment from salary or wages of public employee.

Bill #: HB 2062 Title: Appliance Energy Efficiency Subject: Energy
 Position: Staff: ML

Status: Chapter 108, (2021 Laws): effective on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Establishes energy efficiency standards for certain appliances sold or offered for sale in this state. Removes requirement that certain appliances sold or offered for sale in this state meet state energy efficiency standards.
 Authorizes Director of State Department of Energy to update energy efficiency standards by rule.
 Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: [HB 2070](#) **Title:** Timber Tax 3/5ths**Subject:** Finance & Tax
Position: **Staff:** HW**Status:** In committee upon adjournment.

Extends privilege taxes on merchantable forest products harvested on forestlands.] Sets rates for taxes on privilege of harvesting merchantable forest products harvested on forestlands. Combines rates for three privilege taxes that are subject to biennial sunset and dedicates stated percentages of moneys from such taxes to respective purposes. Eliminates role of Oregon Forest Resources Institute board in establishing rate of privilege tax dedicated to purposes of institute. Requires changes to rates of privilege taxes or to percentages of three combined taxes dedicated to respective purposes, and review of programs funded by taxes, to be based on harvest forecast contained in most recently released quarterly economic and revenue forecast as of last day of February of odd-numbered year. Prohibits Oregon Forest Resources Institute from expending moneys from privilege tax for general advertising on behalf of institute or institute members. Requires Legislative Revenue Officer to submit report, to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to revenue, on various subjects related to forest products harvest privilege taxes not later than February 1, 2022. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: [HB 2076](#) **Title:** EMS Overhaul**Subject:** Public Safety
Position: **Staff:** ML**Status:** In committee upon adjournment.

Establishes Emergency Health Care Systems Program and Emergency Health Care System Advisory Board within Oregon Health Authority. Directs authority to designate emergency health care centers for provision of cardiac and pediatric emergency health care. Modifies terminology related to emergency medical services. Authorizes Governor to make available for use emergency medical services personnel and equipment. Creates offense of unlawful operation of unlicensed emergency medical services agency. Punishes by maximum of 364 days' imprisonment, \$6,250 fine, or both. Becomes operative January 1, 2022. Directs authority to designate emergency health care regions within state. Becomes operative January 1, 2023. Directs authority to designate emergency health care centers for provision of stroke and trauma emergency health care. Directs program to establish emergency health care data systems for collection of information related to emergency health care in this state. Requires licensure for nontransport EMS service. Defines "nontransport EMS service." Becomes operative January 1, 2025. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Directs Public Employees' Benefit Board and Oregon Educators Benefit Board to study ways to transform delivery systems to contain costs and report to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2022.

Bill #: [HB 2118](#) **Title:** WC Emergency Workers**Subject:** Workers Comp
Position: **Staff:** HW**Status:** In committee upon adjournment.

Transfers responsibility for provision of workers' compensation coverage to qualified emergency service volunteer from Office of Emergency Management to public body under whose direction volunteer is acting.

Bill #: [HB 2119](#) **Title:** 211 From OEM to DHS**Subject:** Public Safety
Position: **Staff:** HW**Status:** Chapter 111, (2021 Laws): Effective date January 1, 2022.

Transfers responsibility for 2-1-1 system from Office of Emergency Management to Department of Human Services. Modifies terminology related to 2-1-1 system. Repeals law relating to duty to contract for creation of 2-1-1 system. Modifies laws relating to financial contributions for 2-1-1 system.

Bill #: [HB 2129](#) **Title:** Volunteer Checkoff**Subject:** Public Safety
Position: **Staff:** HW**Status:** Chapter 8, (2021 Laws): effective on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Updates statutes governing contributions of personal income tax refunds by checkoff. Provides that all charitable and governmental entities that submit applications and that are eligible to receive contributions of taxpayer refunds by checkoff are to be included on schedule of individual income tax return. Replaces system for screening and listing entities that employs eligibility roster and rotation of eligible entities through form listing and instruction listing. Aligns processes for ongoing review of entities included on return with current practice. Applies to tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2021. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 2137 Title: Transportation ODOT Housekeeping

Subject: Transportation

Status: Chapter 12, (2021 Laws): Effective date May 6, 2021.

Modifies, adds and repeals laws related to transportation.
Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 2138 Title: Transportation RC

Subject: Transportation
Position: Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Modifies, adds and repeals laws related to transportation.

Bill #: HB 2142 Title: OWRD Fees

Subject: Water
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Chapter 515, (2021 Laws): Effective date July 19, 2021.

Increases certain fees charged by Water Resources Department. Creates fee for additional points of appropriation included in application for approval of change to existing water right or permit.
Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2021.

Bill #: HB 2143 Title: Hydroelectric Fees

Subject: Water
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Chapter 516, (2021 Laws): Effective date September 25, 2021.

Changes annual fees for all power claimants to match annual fees for other hydroelectric projects.
Changes annual relicensing and reauthorization fees to match annual fees for other hydroelectric projects.
Revises fee structure for annual hydroelectric project fee. Changes timing requirement for appointment of panel to review fee amount.
Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 2144 Title: Water Transfers

Subject: Water

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Requires Water Resources Department to study laws relating to transfers of, or other changes to, rights to store water. Requires department to report study results no later than September 15, 2022.

Bill #: HB 2145 Title: Well Drillers

Subject: Water
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Chapter 610, (2021 Laws): Effective date January 1, 2022.

Establishes Water Well Abandonment, Repair and Replacement Fund. Continuously appropriates moneys in fund to Water Resources Department for purpose of providing financial assistance to persons and certain institutions to carry out well abandonment, repair or replacement.
Creates additional qualification required for receipt of water well constructor's license. Creates exception for existing licensees.
Creates condition for renewal of water well constructor's license.
Changes requirements for submission of information to commission prior to commencing work on well. Requires commission rulemaking. Requires that submission of information after July 1, 2024, be in electronic form.
Changes composition of Well Constructors Continuing Education Committee. Extends sunset for provisions regarding well constructor continuing education.
Appropriates moneys to Water Resources Department out of General Fund for certain technical services.
Appropriates moneys to department out of General Fund for deposit in Water Well Abandonment, Repair and Replacement Fund.

Modifies definition of "public or private official" for purposes of mandatory child abuse reporting.

Bill #: HB 2160 Title: UGB Expansion

Subject: Land Use
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Chapter 112, (2021 Laws): effective on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Authorizes Land Conservation and Development Commission to approve plans for urban growth boundary expansion to accommodate affordable housing in Pendleton.
Sunsets affordable housing pilot program on January 2, 2028.
Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 2168 Title: Juneteenth Holiday

Subject: General Government
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Chapter 201, (2021 Laws): Effective date September 25, 2021.

Establishes Juneteenth as legal state holiday.
Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 2170 Title: Project Public Engagement

Subject: Water
Position: Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Authorizes provider of water project support to make support available to local organizations and local governments for purpose of developing local community engagement plans for water projects. Requires provider to give priority to water project support for local organizations and local governments that use information, plans, goals and best practices to ensure that disproportionately affected communities, Indian tribes and persons representative of community demographics are properly included in water project decision-making. Allows provider to condition water project support on local organization or local government use of provider-recognized best practices related to equitable participation in water project decision-making process. Requires provider of water project support to periodically coordinate with other providers to update and ensure uniform application of best practices.

Bill #: HB 2173 Title: Regional Solutions

Subject: General Government
Position: Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Provides that counties may authorize Oregon Department of Administrative Services to make deductions from lottery revenues dedicated to county economic development purposes may be transferred to Oregon Department of Administrative Services] to pay for portion of costs of regional solutions coordinators within Regional Solutions Program.

Bill #: HB 2174 Title: Forrest Reserve Money

Subject: Finance & Taxation
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Chapter 113, (2021 Laws): Effective date January 1, 2022.

Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services, upon request of county governing body, to credit forest reserve moneys that would otherwise be credited to county road fund to certain public bodies whose service areas include entire county.

Bill #: HB 2180 Title: Vehicles RC

Subject: General Government
Position: Staff: ML

Status: Chapter 152, (2021 Laws): Effective date January 1, 2022.

Requires Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to amend state building code to require that new construction of certain buildings include provisions for electrical service capacity for specified percentage of parking spaces. Allows municipality to adopt local percentage of parking space requirements higher than state building code requirements. Requires director to make code amendments effective July 1, 2022.

Bill #: HB 2184 Title: Electric Busses

Subject: Transportation
Position: Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Directs Department of Environmental Quality to provide interest-free loans to school districts, mass transit districts and transportation districts for purchase of electric buses and charging infrastructure for electric buses. Authorizes issuance of revenue bonds to finance loan program.

Bill #: HB 2185 Title: Biodiesel

Subject: Transportation
Position: Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Requires diesel fuel that retail dealers, nonretail dealers and wholesale dealers sell or offer for sale in this state to contain at least five percent biodiesel during period that begins on October 2 of each year and ends on March 31 of following year and to contain at least 20 percent biodiesel during period that begins on April 1 and ends on October 1 of each year.

Bill #: HB 2187 Title: Transportation Electrification

Subject: Transportation
Position: Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Requires electric companies to expend any revenues from participation as credit aggregator or credit generator in clean fuels program on transportation electrification. Requires Public Utility Commission to report annually to Legislative Assembly on programs funded by electric companies with clean fuels program revenues. Requires consumer-owned utilities to expend any revenues from participation as credit aggregator or credit generator in clean fuels program on transportation electrification. Requires governing bodies of consumer-owned utilities to report annually to Legislative Assembly on programs funded by consumer-owned utilities with clean fuels program revenues. Sunsets January 2, 2027.

Bill #: HB 2188 Title: Transportation Electrification

Subject: Transportation
Position: Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Requires electric companies and consumer-owned utilities to transfer no less than 20 percent of revenue from monetization of clean fuels credits to Public Purpose Fund Administrator. Requires Public Purpose Fund Administrator to use revenue to provide grants for transportation electrification.

Bill #: HB 2192 Title: Pesticides

Subject: Environment
Position: Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Establishes Interagency Science Review Panel on Pesticides within Oregon Health Authority. Requires panel to review registration application for pesticides and devices containing pesticides not already holding valid registration with State Department of Agriculture. Requires panel to conduct review for certain other pesticides and devices. Requires panel to make determination regarding safety of pesticide or device. Requires that department classify pesticide or device consistently with panel determination.

Bill #: HB 2194 Title: Tuition Assistance

Subject: Public Safety
Position: Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission to provide grants to qualified public safety and healthcare employees to attend community colleges, public universities, or Oregon Health and Science University. Establishes Public Safety and Healthcare Personnel Scholarship Fund for purpose of funding grants. Limits, for purposes of personal income taxation, availability of itemized deductions. Directs Department of Revenue to make annual transfer of amount equal to estimated increase in revenue attributable to restrictions on itemized deductions allowed personal income taxpayers to fund. Applies to tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2022. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 2204 Title: Public Safety OTCA

Subject: Insurance
Position: Staff: HW

Status: Chapter 519, (2021 Laws): Effective date July 19, 2021.

Provides that public safety officer who represents that person is acting as employee or agent of public body is acting in scope of employment for purposes of Oregon Tort Claims Act.] Increases damages limitations under Oregon Tort Claims Act for claims for acts or omissions of public safety officers. Provides for award of attorney fees.] Provides that person may bring civil action for damages incurred as result of police officer's failure to report or intervene in misconduct.] Expands statewide online database maintained by Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to include settlements of claims against police officers involving misconduct. Requires department to investigate settlements to determine if discipline is warranted.] Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to establish program to award grants for restorative justice programs. Directs commission to report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary concerning awarding of grants. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 2207 Title: OTCA Limits

Subject: Insurance

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Raises limitation on damages for torts of local public bodies to amount of limitation on damages for torts of state. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Bill #: HB 2211 Title: Condemnation

Subject: Land Use
Position: Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Allows owner of condemned property to require binding or nonbinding arbitration for claims without respect to amount in controversy. Confirms compilation of section 5, chapter 274, Oregon Laws 2005, and section 1, chapter 433, Oregon Laws 2005, with Ballot Measure 39 (2006).

Bill #: HB 2215 Title: Official Misconduct

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Modifies crimes of official misconduct in the second degree and official misconduct in the first degree.

Bill #: HB 2218 Title: Economic Development RC Subject: Economic Development
 Position: Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Directs Department of State Lands] Oregon Business Development Department to study impact of laws related to wetlands on economic development and to provide results of study in report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2022.
 Sunsets January 2, 2023.
 Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

Bill #: HB 2222 Title: Public Meetings Subject: Public Meetings
 Position: Staff: ML

Status: In committee upon adjournment.

Modifies definition of "meeting" for purposes of public meetings law to state that meeting may occur without regard to location or stated purpose for which members of governing body convene. Excludes one-on-one meetings of two members of governing body from definition of "meeting," even if serial one-on-one meetings take place between members of governing body. Establishes affirmative duty of chief administrative officer of public body or employee of public body who routinely and customarily advises governing body on public meetings law requirements to advise governing body on whether meeting content qualifies for executive session. Establishes joint and several liability for specified public body officers and employees who, with willful misconduct, fail or incorrectly advise governing body of meeting content's eligibility for executive session. Directs State Forestry Department to implement program to reduce wildfire risk, report to Legislative Assembly, Governor, State Wildfire Programs Director and Wildfire Programs Advisory Council no later than January 15, 2022, and July 15, 2023, establish small forestland grant program, adopt certain rules concerning prescribed fires, establish system of smoke detection cameras and assess and improve wildfire response capacity. Establishes Oregon Conservation Corps Program and Oregon Conservation Corps Advisory Committee. Establishes Oregon Conservation Corps Fund in State Treasury. Makes certain changes concerning wildland-urban interface. Directs Governor to appoint State Wildfire Programs Director. Establishes Wildfire Programs Advisory Council.
